#### TO RECOGNIZE STEVE HARE

WHEREAS, Steve Hare has served the citizens of Rock County for over twenty-eight (28) years as a dedicated and valued employee of Rock County; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Hare began his career in Human Services on September 24, 1990 in the Child Protective Services Division as an Ongoing Case Worker. In this role he assisted parents and children to maintain family unity by ensuring abuse and neglect were no longer a part of the environment. Mr. Hare supported parents in their homes and met with children in the schools to talk about their daily lives making sure they were no longer mistreated; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Hare transitioned into the Juvenile Probation Division as an Intensive Aftercare Worker on December 11, 1991 to work under a grant which provided intensive support and extensive supervision to youth who were released from institutions and now living in the community. Mr. Hare was the liaison between the State and county workers developing discharge plans and assisting county staff to implement the plans effectively. Mr. Hare also had to provide the courts disposition reports indicating if he felt the child needed additional support such as out-of-home placement, electronic monitoring, or corrections; and,

WHEREAS, when the grant ended in February 1993, the concept of the grant was maintained and Mr. Hare was hired into a permanent position as an Intensive Supervision Worker. Mr. Hare's role and focus changed some in that more emphasis was placed on prevention and working with youth *before* they entered institutions. Mr. Hare's caseload and attention was with youth from northern Rock County keeping them on track and avoiding placement; and,

WHEREAS, on October 11, 1999, Mr. Hare accepted a position within the Juvenile Justice Division in the Electronic Monitoring Program where he worked with youth who were court ordered to participate in a monitored bracelet program. Mr. Hare set up the bracelets, organized the schedules and followed-up with the schools and parents making sure youth were following program rules; and,

WHEREAS, on March 4, 2004, Mr. Hare moved to the Long Term Support Division as a Waiver case manager for elderly and physically disabled adults. Mr. Hare completed wait list assessments, functional screens, developed service plans, coordinated service delivery, and on occasion, completed elder abuse investigations. In this role, Mr. Hare ensured the health, safety, and dignity of his clients in the community as opposed to nursing home care. # EXECUTIVE SUMMARY HALL OF HONOR INDUCTION 2019

The Hall of Honor Committee met on Thursday, May 30, 2019 and recommends Sandra Kraft, Alfred Funk and Tom Presny be inducted into the Rock County Hall of Honor.

Sandra Kraft has been involved with animal causes for many years before being elected to the Rock County Board of Supervisors in 2000. Sandra served as the County Board's Vice-Chair from 2008 to 2018. Ms. Kraft was instrumental in starting the annual Rock County Rabies Clinic with her involvement with the Friends of Noah organization. Ms. Kraft's background as Town of Fulton Treasurer (1986-1993), Clerk/Treasurer (1993-2000) and Clerk/Treasurer for the City of Evansville (2000 - 2005) have proved invaluable to her service on the Rock County Board of Supervisors.

Alfred ("Al") Funk's service on the Rock County Veteran's Service Commission (since 2002) is just one example of Mr. Funk's commitment to improving the quality of life of Rock County's veteran community. He led the American Legion Post #205 as Post Commander in the 1950's, 1960's, 1980's and 1990's. He also chaired a number of state American Legion Committees.
