AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF NEW PLAYGROUND STRUCTURE FOR SWEET-ALLYN COUNTY PARK

The purpose of this resolution is to authorize the purchase of a new playground structure for Sweet-Allyn County Park from BCI Burke Company, LLC of Fond Du Lac, Wisconsin in the amount of \$38,972.82. A quote was solicited through the National IPA purchasing cooperative using BCI Burke Company, LLC – contract number R170301. The quote of \$38,972.82 includes purchase, installation, and shipping of the new playground structure that meets our specifications.

The playground project will be funded through the Parks Capital Improvement Account. This project was planned and budgeted at \$50,000. The remaining balance will cover site work and materials that are required for the installation of the playground.

Sweet-Allyn County Park is a 39-acre park located in the Town of Turtle and the current playground structure is in desperate need of updating. The park amenities include a picnic shelter, restrooms, parking, memorial, baseball field, river access, grills, and picnic tables. The new playground structure will be an asset to the park.

Executive Summary

SSM Health St. Mary's Hospital has made funding available for non-profit organizations who are addressing a Community Health Need Priority in the Janesville area. (Obesity, Tobacco Use, Substance Abuse and/or a Social Determinant of Health).

The Rock County Sheriff's Office RECAP Program has applied for up to \$5,000 in funding to initiate the Gardens to Go Program. This program is designed to help the community to fight hunger during these difficult times, as well as provide a way for the RECAP participants to give back to their community. Gardens to Go will provide a self-sufficient way for willing participants to receive the means to grow their own healthy food.

The Gardens to Go planter box kits would consist of a completely constructed planter box, soil, and a variety of seeds that are easy to grow. Gardens to Go would like to offer ten gardens to each of the local food pantries they donate to within Rock County. These organizations would have the responsibility of gathering interested clients who would benefit the most. The RECAP Program Site Supervisor would deliver the raised planters to the clients, if needed, or have a designated pick-up time at the RECAP garden. The Gardens to Grow Program would also like to reach out to schools, homeless shelters, assisted living facilities, church youth groups, etc.

By providing Gardens to Go to those in need, we want to create healthy food choices for the participants, as well as a sense of accomplishment of maintaining their own garden, and the ability to produce essential food sources. Participants would learn valuable gardening skills that they can pass on to others. The educational benefit of this program would be available to the RECAP participants as well, as they will be learning useful life skills, and giving back to their communities.

The SSM Health Mini Grant funds will be used for the purchase of materials and supplies needed to construct the Gardens to Go planter boxes, including soil and seeds.

APPROVING THE PURCHASE OF PARTS FOR REPAIR TO AIRPORT EQUIPMENT AND AMENDING THE SOUTHERN WISCONSIN REGIONAL AIRPORT BOARD BUDGET

In 2011 the airport took delivery of a 2010 Caterpillar Loader with a 2011 SnoGo blower attachment at a contract cost of \$384,350. This piece of equipment is critical to the Airport's snow removal process and is used to blow piles of plowed snow off the pavement and out of Airport's movement and non-movement areas.

On February 12, 2021 during snow removal operations the lower gear box assembly became inoperable and caused a catastrophic failure of the machine. Wausau Equipment Company, Inc. located in New Berlin is the manufacturer of this piece of equipment and based on the letter dated February 25, 2021 from Christine Shepherd, Customer Service Manager for Wausau Equipment Company, Inc., is the sole provider of parts that can be used to repair it. The quote for the parts for this repair is \$31,696.08 and does not include freight.

Shipping costs are unknown at this time and the airport is requesting an additional \$500 in contingency to go towards shipping costs and any other incidental expenses incurred during the repair of this equipment. Airport staff can perform the repair saving the cost of labor.

This resolution extends the Intergovernmental Agreement between the City of Beloit, the County of Rock and the Ho-Chunk Nation. It relates to the construction and operation of a Class III gaming facility on property currently owned by the Ho-Chunk Nation in the City of Beloit. The previous IGA is set to expire at its three-year deadline. This resolution is to amend the existing IGA until June 30, 2022. The County recognizes that such a facility would be beneficial to area residents by providing employment opportunities and promoting economic development. The amendment of the IGA would continue to provide that the Ho-Chunk Nation would make payments equaling 2% of the net win proceeds to the City of Beloit, of which the County would receive 30%.

THIRD AMENDMENT OF INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

THIS THIRD AMENDMENT TO INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT ("Third Amendment") is effective on March 26, 2021 ("Third Amendment Effective Date") by and between the HO-CHUNK NATION, a federally recognized Indian Tribe organized under Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act (the "Nation"), the CITY OF BELOIT, a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the state of Wisconsin (the "City"), and the COUNTY OF ROCK (the "County"), a municipal corporation organized under the laws of the state of Wisconsin. The Nation, City and County are each a "Party" and are collectively the "Parties."

The Parties entered into that certain Intergovernmental Agreement with an Execution Date of March 26, 2012 (the "Original IGA"). The Parties amended the IGA pursuant to that certain Second Amendment of Intergovernmental Agreement with an effective date of January 29, 2018 ("Second Amendment"). The Original IGA, as amended by the Second Amendment, is the "IGA." The Parties wish to amend Section 4.3 of the IGA to extend the date of automatic expiration from March 26, 2021 to June 30, 2022.

The Parties further agree as follows:

- 1. Defined Terms. Any capitalized term used but not defined in this Third Amendment has the meaning given it in the IGA.
- 2. Automatic Expiration Extension. Section 4.3 of the Second Amendment is hereby deleted in its entirety and replaced with the following:
 - Section 4.3. Automatic Expiration. Unless the Parties agree otherwise in writing, this IGA automatically expires and becomes null and void on June 30, 2022 if the Trust Approval Date has not then occurred. However, if the Trust Approval Date has occurred on or before June 30, 2022, then this Section 4.3 shall be deemed deleted from this IGA.
- 3. Full Force and Effect. Except as modified by this Third Amendment, the IGA and all of its terms and conditions are in full force and effect.
- 4. Counterparts. This Third Amendment may be executed in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which together shall constitute one agreement. Original signatures sent by facsimile or by electronic mail shall be accepted as originals and shall be binding upon the Parties.
