Executive Summary Authorizing Submission of Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grant Program

The U.S. Department of Justice, Office Justice Programs has announced a grant opportunity titled Paul Coverdell Forensic Science Improvement Grants Programs. The grant provides funding of up to \$175,000 to develop and operate innovative programs that enhance and improve the quality and timeliness of forensic science and coroner services. Funds may be used for any of the following: Personnel; Computerization; Certain laboratory; Medicolegal equipment; Accreditation; Education, Training, and Certification; Facilities improvements; Certain administrative expenses; and/or to provide needed services to the community. The programs to be funded must be geared toward overall forensic and coroner functions and enhancements.

This is a competitive grant with no local match or cost-sharing requirement. The intent of the Coroner's Office is to obtain federal funding which will be used to off-set budget shortfalls for necessary and federally mandated equipment and items as outlined by the U.S Department of Justice "National Guidelines for Death Investigations" which was designed to implement and support programs to enhance forensic investigations and criminal justice outcomes as well as to provide training opportunities for coroner staff and law enforcement personnel as available (depending upon the amount of the award).
