



On a Plat Of Survey by Richard L. Thom, dated July 20, 1977, Mr. Thom shows that he set a 1" pin at the center of Section 22. On C.S.M. No. 935213, by Richard L. Thom, recorded on Feb. 3, 1981 in Vol. 10, Pg. 205 of Certified Surveys, Card 68, Image 735, Mr. Thom shows that he set a 3/4" at the center of Section 22. The 3/4" rod I found and show on this Monument Record fits Mr. Thom's recorded position.
