




O WITNESS MONUMENT 1/2 X 24 REROD

POLY MON 1.2' SOUTH OF E/W FENCE 9' WEST OF OLD NIS FENCE YELLOW CARSONITE ON NORTH SIDE



SHOW A PLAN VIEW DRAWING DEPICTING THE CORNER MONUMENT AND SURROUNDING PHYSICAL FEATURES, INCLUDING THE EXCAVATION AREA AND DEPTH. THE CORNER MONUMENT SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERISTICS: 1) HAVE AT LEAST TWO PREDETERMINED BREAK-OFF POINTS. 2) IF BROKEN, LEAVE A PERMANENTLY MAGNETIZED REMNANT AT THE ORIGINAL POINT. 3) MUST BE EXTENDABLE. 4) THE CAP IS INSCRIBED - ROCK COUNTY SURVEY MONUMENT - PENALTY FOR DISTURBING MARKER. 5) OR AN EXISTING CUT LIMESTONE. AN IRON PIPE 12 4'0" (MINIMUM) MAY BE USED IN AREAS WHERE GROUND WATER IS WITHIN ONE FOOT OF THE SURFACE. IF THE CORNER IS OCCUPIED BY AN IMPROVEMENT (MANHOLE, BURIED CABLE, ETC.) ANY DURABLE, DISTINCT MONUMENT MAY BE USED. CORNERS SHALL BE REFERENCED WITH AT LEAST 4 DURABLE WITNESS MONUMENTS. WITNESS MONUMENTS SHALL BE MADE OF CONCRETE, NATURAL STONE, IRON OR OTHER EQUALLY DURABLE MATERIAL, EXCEPT WOOD. DESCRIBE THE CORNER AND THE WITNESS MONUMENTS. CORNER CODE:

1859 RUGER VOL 1 PG 110 SURROUNDED POST WITH 3 HARDHEADS. SHOWS DISTANCES TO THE NORTH, SOUTH, AND WEST. 1879 RUGER VOL 2 PG 214 SHOWS STAKE SURROUNDED BY STONES. ALSO SHOWS DISTANCES TO THE EAST, WEST, AND SOUTH.

I EXCAVATED AS SHOWN IN THE SKETCH AND FOUND 4 LARGE
HARDHEADS. 2 OF THE HARDHEADS WITH ABUTTING EACH OTHER IN A
NORTH/SOUTH DIRECTION. UNDER THOSE THERE WERE 2 MORE LARGE
HARDHEADS IN THE SAME PATTERN. THESE STONES WERE IN HARMONY WITH
RUGER'S 1859 PRORATED DISTANCE FROM THE SE AND NE CORNERS OF
SECTION 31 AND THE EAST/WEST DISTANCE FROM THE CENTER OF SECTION
32 AS COMPARED AGAINST ALL OF RUGER'S 1859 DISTANCES THAT I
MEASURED BETWEEN IN SECTION 32. I REPLACED HARDHEADS WITH POLY
MONUMENT. FOUND ONLY 2 OTHER SMALL HH THAT WERE NOTATED CACABOTTER IN ENTIRE
WAS THE COTHER TESTING OF (1) an Obliterated evidence location. Or. (2) a Hole.


