2 3 WHEREAS, the Rock County Board of Supervisors, representing the citizens of Rock County, wish to recognize the Rock County Human Services Social Workers for their

WHEREAS, March has been declared National Social Worker Recognition Month; and

5 excellence in delivering services to the citizens of Rock County; and

WHEREAS, the Social Workers of the Rock County Department of Human Services provide services to a wide variety of Rock County citizens, and 8

WHEREAS, Social Workers in the Mental Health area provide crisis counseling and treatment services to reduce the need for hospital based care; and services to maintain clients in the community; and provide family crisis services, in-home family services as well as services to children with severe and persistent mental illness to provide support to the families and reduce the need for out of home placement of children and adolescents by providing services to Rock County residents who otherwise might be a danger to self or others, and further by addressing emotional/behavioral patterns that otherwise adversely impact on the family and community; and

WHEREAS, the Social Workers in the Juvenile Justice Services Division provide an invaluable service to the Rock County community by guiding and providing services to at-risk youth and their families. On a weekly basis they make difficult decisions that balance the need to keep the Rock County community safe and direct youth to a crime free life; and

WHEREAS, the Child Protective Services Social Workers provide essential safety services and respond to reports of abuse and neglect and work to control for the safety of children who are at risk of abuse, maltreatment and/or neglect, and intervene to alter the conditions within the families which create the risk of maltreatment and/or neglect, relying upon home-based services and collaboration with other professionals providing essential services to these children/families; and

WHEREAS, the Social Workers in the Adult Community Services area provide services to individuals with persistent and chronic mental illness assisting them to live in the community; and prevent costly hospitalizations whenever possible; and

WHEREAS, the Social Workers in the Long Term Support Division perform critical work to ensure the health and safety of the frail elderly and physically disabled living in the Long Term Support social workers conduct thorough investigations on elder/adult abuse and neglect reports, coordinate services to those individuals unable to meet their basic needs, and provide a social outlet to those unable to leave their homes; all of which assists these individuals to remain independently with dignity in the community; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors, duly assembled this _ __day of _, 2012, do hereby recognize the Rock County Social Workers for their excellent work and diligent efforts in the delivery of services to needy Rock County citizens and their families in 2012.

Executive Summary

Authorizing Acceptance of Permanency Roundtable Funding and Amending the 2012 Human Services Department Budget

This resolution authorizes acceptance of \$6,148 from the Wisconsin Department of Children and Families to conduct permanency roundtables for twenty-four Child Protective Services and Juvenile Justices cases (families).

A permanency roundtable is an intervention designed to facilitate the permanency planning process for youth in out-of-home care by identifying realistic solutions to permanency obstacles for youth and moving them to a permanent living arrangement. The youth's case manager, supervisor, permanency consultant, trained facilitator, and other relevant professionals convene to create an individual permanency plan. Funds will be used for supplies and training necessary to conduct the roundtables.

Currently Rock County has 126 youth in out-of-home care placements (101 Foster Home, 7 Group Home, 18 Residential Care Center). The average daily census for 2011 was 135 youth in out-of-home placements.

No additional county funds are required.

Executive Summary

In the spring of 2011, Charmian Klyve asked management staff to examine a gap in the system of care for children. Her concern was that on occasion, children and families with complex issues come into contact with Human Services systems that are not designed to deal with the problems at hand. That mismatch can result in the child placed in substitute care due to the lack of an alternative treatment model. Those placements are costly, long-term and sometimes result in children aging-out of an institutional setting.

The ad hoc group "tasked" itself with identifying and articulating the system gaps for those children who present challenges and to make cost effective modifications in service delivery. In particular, the system gaps included outpatient behavioral health and other resources for children at risk of out-of-home placements and who would benefit from wraparound services.

In July, 2011, Zia Partners, the Consultant for the CJCC, released its report. That report validated the ad hoc group's contention that there were gaps in the system of care for children. By the fall of 2011, the group reached consensus that the logical step was to implement the Coordinated Services Team (CST) initiative under the Adolescent Services Unit within the Mental Health Division that would work collaboratively with both Child Protective Services and Juvenile Justice Divisions. The concept calls for reassigning duties of existing staff within the Department. The CST Unit will consist of 4 staff that should be fully trained so that they are able to serve approximately 42 families by the beginning of 2013.

The CST offers a system of care approach to serving children and families regardless of their point of access into the Human Services Department. By definition, the CST is a collaborative approach to respond to children with serious needs in the least restrictive setting. The CST would be an interdisciplinary team, coordinated by a staff member in partnership with the family, service providers, and family advocates, and team members identified by the families. In essence, a unique Child and Family Team is created to develop supports and services for each child and family. The team develops an individualized plan of care based on the child's needs, age, gender, and culture.

Recent statutory changes to Section 46.56, Stats., formalized the requirements for counties that wish to create a CST initiative for children and families. In addition, the statutory changes require the County Board to create a CST Advisory Committee and designate an agency to operate the program. This resolution meets those requirements by creating a 21-member advisory committee and designates the Human Services Department to operate the CST program.

This resolution and the CST initiative has no budgetary impact in 2012. The Human Services Department has received \$80,000 of state funds and a 20% local match in its 2012 Budget for this initiative. Those state dollars are an offset to staff salaries. It is anticipated that staff assigned to the CST Unit will bill for MA case management dollars. Thus, it is anticipated that this initiative will result in a "budget to budget" net increase in revenue of \$46,000 in 2013.
