





PLACE MONUMENT SYMBOL (*) AT PROPER LOCATION ON ABOVE INDEX





SHOW A PLAN VIEW DRAWING DEPICTING THE CORNER MONUMENT AND SURROUNDING PHYSICAL FEATURES, INCLUDING THE EXCAVATION AREA AND DEPTH. THE CORNER MONUMENT SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERISTICS: 1) HAVE AT LEAST TWO PREDETERMINED BREAK-OFF POINTS. 2) IF BROKEN, LEAVE A PERMANENTLY MAGNETIZED REMNANT AT THE ORIGINAL POINT. 3) MUST BE EXTENDABLE. 4) THE CAP IS INSCRIBED : ROCK COUNTY SURVEY MONUMENT - PENALTY FOR DISTURBING MARKER. 5) OR AN EXISTING CUT LIMESTONE. AN IRON PIPE 1/2" x 4'0" (MINIMUM) MAY BE USED IN AREAS WHERE GROUND WATER IS WITHIN ONE FOOT OF THE SURFACE. IF THE CORNER IS OCCUPIED BY AN IMPROVEMENT (MANHOLE, BURIED CABLE, ETC.) ANY DURABLE , DISTINCT MONUMENT MAY BE USED. CORNERS SHALL BE REFERENCED WITH AT LEAST 4 DURABLE WITNESS MONUMENTS. WITNESS MONUMENTS SHALL BE MADE OF CONCRETE, NATURAL STONE, IRON OR OTHER EQUALLY DURABLE MATERIAL, EXCEPT WOOD. DESCRIBE THE CORNER AND THE WITNESS MONUMENTS.


