


SHOW A PLAN VIEW DRAWING DEPICTING THE CORNER MONUMENT AND SURROUNDING PHYSICAL FEATURES, INCLUDING THE EXCAVATION AREA AND DEPTH. THE CORNER MONUMENT SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERISTICS: 1) HAVE AT LEAST TWO PREDETERMINED BREAK-OFF POINTS. 2) IF BROKEN, LEAVE A PERMANENTLY MAGNETIZED REMNANT AT THE ORIGINAL POINT. 3) MUST BE EXTENDABLE. 4) THE CAP IS INSCRIBED ROCK COUNTY SURVEY MONUMENT - PENALTY FOR DISTURBING MARKER. 5) OR AN EXISTING CUT LIMESTONE. AN IRON PIPE 1 × 4'0" (MINIMUM) MAY BE USED IN AREAS WHERE GHOUND WATER IS WITHIN ONE FOOT OF THE SURFACE. IF THE CORNER IS OCCUPIED BY AN IMPROVEMENT (MANHOLE, BURIED CABLE, ETC.) ANY DURABLE, DISTINCT MONUMENT MAY BE USED. CORNERS SHALL BE REFERENCED WITH AT LEAST 4 DURABLE WITNESS MONUMENTS. WITNESS MONUMENTS SHALL BE MADE OF CONCRETE, NATURAL STONE, IRON OR OTHER EQUALLY DURABLE MATERIAL, EXCEPT WOOD. DESCRIBE THE CORNER AND THE WITNESS MONUMENTS.

  - 1869 LEE VOL 1 PG 353 FOUND REMAINS OF STONE IN CENTER OF ROAD AND IN LINE WITH OLD SOD FENCE THAT IS EAST & WEST. SET HH 20" LONG.
  - 1973 LEE VOL 5 PG 2 SHOWS DISTANCES BUT DOES NOT EXPLAIN HOW HE ESTABLISHED THE CORNER.
  - 1974 LEE VOL 5 PG 17 RE-SET MONUMENT INCORRECT AS SET IN 1973 TRAVERSE. REFERENCED CORNER.


