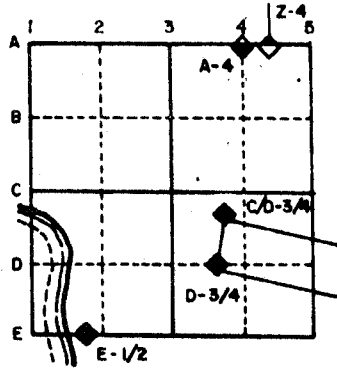

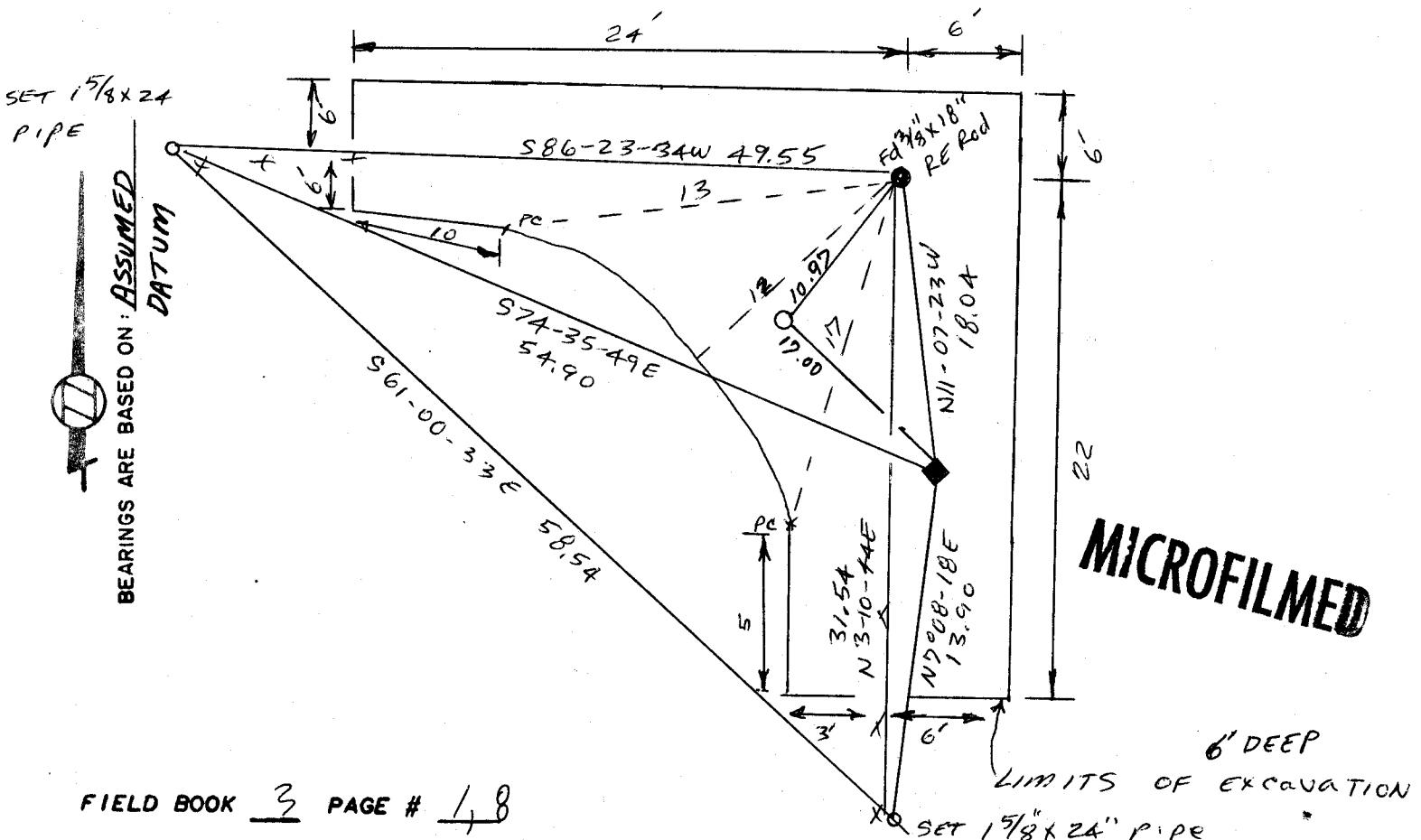

SHOW A PLAN VIEW DRAWING DEPICTING THE CORNER MONUMENT AND SURROUNDING PHYSICAL FEATURES, INCLUDING THE EXCAVATION AREA AND DEPTH. THE CORNER MONUMENT SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOWING CHARACTERISTICS: 1) HAVE AT LEAST TWO PREDETERMINED BREAK-OFF POINTS. 2) IF BROKEN, LEAVE A PERMANENTLY MAGNETIZED REMNANT AT THE ORIGINAL POINT. 3) MUST BE EXTENDABLE. 4) THE CAP IS INSCRIBED: ROCK COUNTY SURVEY MONUMENT - PENALTY FOR DISTURBING MARKER. 5) OR AN EXISTING CUT LIMESTONE. AN IRON PIPE 1 1/2" x 4" (MINIMUM) MAY BE USED IN AREAS WHERE GROUND WATER IS WITHIN ONE FOOT OF THE SURFACE. IF THE CORNER IS OCCUPIED BY AN IMPROVEMENT (MANHOLE, BURIED CABLE, ETC.) ANY DURABLE, DISTINCT MONUMENT MAY BE USED. CORNERS SHALL BE REFERENCED WITH AT LEAST 4 DURABLE WITNESS MONUMENTS. WITNESS MONUMENTS SHALL BE MADE OF CONCRETE, NATURAL STONE, IRON OR OTHER EQUALLY DURABLE MATERIAL, EXCEPT WOOD. DESCRIBE THE CORNER AND THE WITNESS MONUMENTS.

(b.) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

1) IN 1880 R.K. LEE ESTABLISHED THE NORTH QUARTER CORNER MIDWAY BETWEEN THE NE & NW CORNERS OF SECTION 2. HE FOUND THE S1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36 T5NR12E WHICH WAS WEST 0.04'. HE STATED THERE WAS A SMALL 4" BLACK OAK TREE AT THE N 1/4 CORNER OF SEC 1.

2) IN 1912 HINTZE DECLARED THE S1/4 CORNER OF SEC 36 LOST AND SET A CONCRETE MONUMENT ON LINE WITH THE SW & SE CORNERS OF SEC 36 AT MID POINT. HIS TOWNSHIP PLAT SHOWS A JOG OF 8.3'. IT APPEARS FROM HIS FIELD NOTES AND THE OTHER JOGS ALONG THE COUNTY LINE THAT THIS WAS A COMPUTATION AND HE DID NOT FIND THE N 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 1.

3) I FOUND A 3/8"X18" REROD AT THE FENCE INTERSECTION & 3 LARGE HARDHEAD STONES IN A TIGHT CLUSTER AT ABOUT 18' SOUTH OF THE REROD.

4) THE DANE COUNTY SURVEYOR, RON RIPP, DID NOT FIND ANY DOCUMENTATION FOR THE REROD OR STONES.

(c.) Was the corner restored through acceptance of (1) an obliterated evidence location, or, (2) a found perpetuated location?

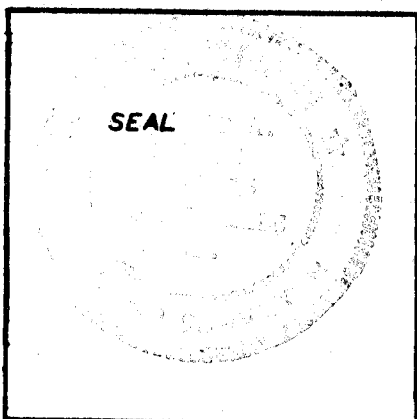
I ACCEPTED THE HARD HEAD STONES BECAUSE THEY WERE IN HARMONY WITH LEE'S SURVEY AND THE MONUMENTS TO THE SOUTH AND THE FENCE INTERSECTION TO THE EAST.
