Whereas upon the application of fifteen freeholders residents of said town of bradford for the laying out of a highway as hereinafter described.

We the undersigned Supervisors of said town did on the 19th day of March 1872 make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application and did meet on the 30th day of March 1892 at 10 o'clock in the forenoon of said day at the house of Volney B. Winegar it being the time and place fixed by us in said notice and having first been satisfied that the notice aforesaid had been duly given five days previous to the time of our said meeting to all the occupants of the lands through which said highway passes and had also been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting in the manner required by law we did then and there proceed to examine personally said highway and did hear all reasons that were offered
