At a meeting of the Supervisors of the town of Milton agreeable to notice posted according to law and such notice having been served on all the occupants of lands through which the following described road passes at least five days previous to our said meeting and having personally examined and heard all reasons that were offered for or against the laying out of the highway in said notice proposed, it is ordered that a highway be laid out in said town of the width of three rods the center line of said highway to commence at the North East corner of a lot formerly owned by W. H. Borden and now owned by John S. Harvey and the South East corner of the lot purchased by C. H. Greenman of Charlotte Omub and in the west line of the public square of the so called Village of Milton; thence to run westerly on the line between said Harveys lot and C. H. Greenmans lot twenty rods; thence North westerly parallel with the South line of Block six in Goodrich Plat of the Village of Milton to the West line of the Street along the west line of said Block, six. Whole distance 44 rods.

At a meeting of the Supervisors of the said town of Milton agreeable to notices posted according to the law and having examined and heard all reasons offered for and against the laying out of the highway in said notices proposed, it is ordered that a highway be laid out in said town of the width of sixty feet according to said petition, beginning at the North side of the street, South of the N.W. and at the South side of the N.E. (said N.W. being denominated the Milwaukee & Prairie du Chine Division of the Milwaukee & Prairie running Northwesterly across said N.W. four rods so as to meet the Street on the North side of N.W. and Northwesterly by said Street on the North side of the N.E. between Blocks 8 & 9 to the highway south of the house of L.B. Rogers, four chains and 25 links, making the highway hereby laid out five chains and 25 links long and 60 feet wide according to the survey made by the Supervisors. Given under our hands this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1866.

Starnards house and one rod West of the East line of said highway from said point as place of beginning run North 16° East 4 rods and 1 link to Sweets Avenue according to an accurate survey made by the said supervisors.

Application for Highway

To the Supervisors of the Town of Milton, County of Rock and State of Wisconsin.

We, the undersigned free holders of the Town of Milton, Rock County, Wisconsin and residing in said town of Milton do hereby make application to you to lay out a highway in said town three rods wide, the center line of which is described as follows, viz; Beginning in the center of highway running easterly and westerly through said section 9 in said town of Milton 2.75 chains east of the quarter corner between section 8 and 9 in said town, thence North along a line parallel with the line between said Sections 11.75 chains, thence Northwesterly at an angle of 38° 12' with said section line 4.25 chains; thence North along said section line 25 chains to the corner of Sections 4, 5, 8, and 9 in said town, thence North along the line between Sections 4 and 5 in said town to a point 13 rods North of the quarter corner between said Section 4 and 5 thence Northwesterly toward Lake Koshkonong to and iron stake in the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter and being lot one of said Section 5 which iron stake was recently set by O. G. Bleedhorn, County Surveyor of said county and is about 25 feet easterly of a hickory tree, thence North 16° West Magnetic Meridian to and across the meandered line of Lake Koshkonong and into said Lake Koshkonong in said section.
