SURVEY BILL OF A HIGHWAY AND A ROAD WARRANT ANNEXED

This day surveyed by direction of the supervisors of the Town of Newark the following described road to wit. Beginning at the southwest end of the Distillery Dam on section thirty-four in said Town, thence running south 70 degrees west thirty-five chains to the southeast corner fo the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of said Section 34. Thence west on the quarter quarter line 48chains, thence north 45 degrees west twenty-nine chains to the section line. The said courses and distances are the center of the road, variation of the magnetic needle 6½ degrees East.

ROAD ORDER TO THE ABOVE SURVEY BILL.

At a meeting of the supervisors of the Town of Newark, all the supervisors having been duly notified to attend the said meeting for the purpose of deliberating upon the subject matter of this order, It is ordered and determined by the said supervisors that the road running west from Goodhue's Distillery in said town be altered, and the said supervisors have caused a survey thereof to be made as follows. The center run thence, Beginning at the south west end of the Distillery dam on section 34 in said Town, thence running south 70 degrees west 35 chains to the south east corner of the north east quarter of the north west quarter of section 34, thence west on the quarter quarter line 48 chains, thence north 45 degrees west 29 chains to the section line intersecting the old road. It is hereby ordered that the Highway laying along said road, and on the section line between the place of beginning and intersecting as aforesaid be discontinued. The width of the road on the aforesaid survey to be the same as it originally was. In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands at Newark on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of May 1852.
