Release of D. L. Pepper

Recites in part,---a piece or parcel of land lying and being in the aforesaid Town of Rock, Wisconsin, described as follows to wit: a strip two rods wide and eighty rods long, it being the East part of the East half of the East half, Southeast quarter, Northwest quarter, Section 6, Township 2, Range 12 East.

Page 284 of Record. (Part of Kessler Road)

Recites in part;---Now therefore pursuant to such application we, the said supervisors do hereby order and determine that a highway be and the same is hereby laid out in said town as follows to wit: Commencing at the Northwest corner of the Northeast quarter of Section 7 of said Town of Rock, and running thence South on the North and South center line of Section 7 to the Chicago and Milwaukee & St. Paul Railway Company right-of-way; thence running Southwesterly parallel to and along said right-of-way 200 feet; thence Southerly 195 feet across said right-of-way thence running Northeasterly 200 feet along and parallel with said right of way to the center line of said Section 7; thence South on the North and South centerline of said Section 7 and Section 18 of said Town of Rock to a point where said line intersects the highway running East and West through the center of said Section 18, the same being an accurate survey of said highway caused by us to be made. The line of said survey is the center of said highway and the same is laid out of the width of 3 rods North of the railroad track. Said road to be 3 rods West of said center line South of said railway track. Said road to be 2 rods West of said center line and 1 rods East of said center line.
