Whereas upon the application of six freeholders residing in said town of Turtle for the laying out of a highway hereinafter described, we the undersigned supervisors of said town did on the second day of November A.D. 1859 meet at the house of E. J. Carpenter in said town for the purpose of then and there deciding upon such application, it being the time and place by us fixed for the purpose and proceed to examine personally such highway and having then and there heard the reason that were offered for and against laying out the same did then and there decide upon such application and determine not to lay out said highway hereinafter described, having as required by law first made out a notice and fixed therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application and the applicant for such highway having five days previous to our said meeting caused such notice to be duly given to all the occupants of the lands through which said highway passes and such notice also having been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting, the service and posting of the above named notice being satisfactorily made to appear, we did decide against the application which is as follows: Commencing at a point in the center of the Shopiere Road near the mill of J. R. Hodson where it is intersected by the highway crossing Turtle Creek in said place on Section 9; thence running Southeasterly to the quarter stake on the South side of said Section 9, it being the center of said South line; thence South on said line running through on Section 16 and 21 to the Milwaukee Road, running through lands owned by John Lewis, Elisha G. Lewis, James Billings, Henry Page, ChancE Ross, E. J. Carpenter, Russell Harvey, John Love, and Phil T. Porter.
