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We the Commissioners of Highways for the Town of Turtle in the County of Rock and Territory of Wisconsin met at the James Jacks February the 11th at ten o'clock A.M. 1848 for the purpose of examining the ground for a road leading from the road near James Jacks to the Milwaukee and Beloit road and described as follows to wit: Beginning at the center of the road on the line between Sections 33 and 34, 5 chains and 50 links North from the quarter stake; thence North $\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ West on said line between Sections 33 and 34, 27 and 28, 21 and 22, 178 chains and 62 links to the Milwaukee Road, and four rods in width, according to true meridian. Variation $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$

And also we met at the house of James A. Harris in said town of Turtle on the 12th day of February at ten A.M. for the purpose of examining the ground petitioned to be laid out as a highway and after being satisfied that notices of the time, places and purposes of these meetings had been given as the law requires, we proceeded to lay out the road as above described, and the following to wit: Beginning at the center of the road two rods West from the quarter stake between Sections 2 and 11 and running South 2 rods West from the center line of Sections 11 and 14, to the Milwaukee Road 111 chains and 25 links in length and four rods in width, East side bounded by said center line of section.

According to true meridian variations $6\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$. Surveyed Feb. 12, 1848 by Johnson.

We undersigned Commissioners of Highways of the aforesaid town of Turtle do certify that we have laid out the above described roads and return the same as a public highway.
