

Order for Laying a Road March 29th A.D. 1854

We the undersigned Supervisors of the town of Fulton, Rock County and State of Wisconsin do hereby certify that we on the application of six or more freeholders and residents of said town asking for the laying out of a public highway in said town caused notices in writing to be posted up in three of the most public places in said town, fixing therein the time when and the place where, we would meet to decide upon the aforesaid application, and also specifying in said notices as near as practicable the road proposed to be laid out and the several tracts of land through which the same might pass which notices were posted up at least ten days before the time fixed therein for said meeting; and we do further certify that being fully satisfied that all the notices required by law to be given to occupants were given pursuant to Statute, we on this 29th day of March A.D. 1854 it being the specified time in said notices for said meeting; met at the house and place therein named and proceeded personally to examine said proposed highway, heard all the reasons for and against laying out the same, and decided that said proposed highway was necessary and proper and we do further certify that thereupon, we caused an accurate survey to be made of said proposed highway which is as follows, to wit: Beginning in the center of the road running past P.M. Carpenter's house where it crosses the East line of land owned by said Carpenter it being near the center of the North West quarter of Section no. 27 in the town of Fulton; thence running Southerly along the East line of said Carpenter's land, and through the center of the South West quarter of Section No. 27 in said town and also continuing South, through the center of the North West quarter of Section No. 34 in said town, to a road running East and West past the house of Samuel Lunn, the whole distance being 172,48 chains, the said course and distance being the center line of said road.

And now therefore we the Supervisors aforesaid in and for the town of Fulton, do on this 29th day of March A.D. 1854 order and declare the above described highway to be a public highway four rods wide and we do further order the same to be opened and kept open as such pursuant to Statute.
