

Whereas upon the application of six freeholders residing in said town of Avon for discontinuing of a highway hereinafter described we the undersigned Supervisors of said town did on the 29th day of June A.D. 1875 meet at the house of John Wallace in said town for the purpose of then & there deciding upon such application it being the time and place fixed by us for that purpose did proceed to examine personally such highway and having then & there heard such reasons as were offered for and against the same did then and there decide upon such application and determined to discontinue said highway as hereinafter described having as required by law first made out a notice and fixed therein a time & place at which we would meet and decide upon such application & the applicants for such highway having five days previous to our said meeting caused such notice to be given to all the occupants of the land through which said highway passes and such notice having also been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting it is ordered and determined and we do hereby order and determine that a highway described as follows, to wit: Commencing at the South West Corner of the South East quarter of the S. West quarter of Section 34 running thence North 32 rods is hereby vacated.
