of abode of each occupant of said lands and had also been posted up in three public places in said town 10 days before the time of our said meeting in the manner required by law. We did then and there proceed to examine personally said highway and did hear any and all reasons that were offered for or against discontinuing the same and did decide upon such application; and it bein our opinion that the public good will thereby be promoted did decide to discontinue such highway as hereinafter described.

Now therefore pursuant to said application we the said supervisors do hereby order and determine that said highway discribed as follows to wit: Beginning at the quarter post of the South West Corner of the Northwest quarter of Section 18 running Easterly across the bridge and down to the highway running Northerly from the Village of Fulton through said Section 18 of the town of Fulton.
(known as the road across the dam)

Now therefore pursuant to said application we the said supervisors do hereby order and determine that said highway above described be and the same is hereby discontinued.

Page 32 of Record Order for Laying out a Highway

Whereas upon the petition of 32 resident freeholders of said county; 16 of who reside in the town of Fulton and 16 of whom reside in the town of Porter for the laying out of a highway in said County as follows; to wit: Beginning at or near the quarter post at the South west corner of the North west quarter of section 18 of the town of Fulton in said county and running; thence Easterly to the highway running North from the Village of Fulton, through said Section 18 said highway to be a continuation of the highway now running East and West through the middle of Section 13 of the town of Porter.

The County Board of Supervisors of said County did duly appoint O. F. Nowlan., W.J. McIntire and Wm. Guill three members of said board as a committee with full power to act in the premises and in appearing to the County Board that the committee did on the 18th day of October 1887 make out a notice duly signed, and fix therein a time and place at which the said committee would meet to decide upon said petition, and did give notice of the time and place of such meeting by publishing the notice so made out for three weeks previous to the time fixed therein in the Janesville Gazette a news paper published in said county. Whereas the aforesaid committee did meet on the 23rd day of December 1887 at 11 o'clock in the forenoon of said day at the store of Howard Lee in the Village of Fulton, it being the time and place fixed thereforin said
