where of an accurate survey has been made which is as follows, to wit: Beginning at the $\frac{1}{4}$ Post on the East line of Section 29 T. 4 N. R. 11 E. thence South on the East line of said Section 29 and on the East line of Section 32, 60.00 chains, to a point 20 chains South of the N.E. corner of said Section 32, said point being the center of the Highway leading past the dwelling of L. Wait in a westerly direction. The whole length of the road is $\frac{3}{4}$ of one mile course given according to the true meridian. Variation of the needle 8° . The line of said survey to be the center of said Highway and the same is established four rods in width.

Porter July 1st 1865

We the undersigned Supervisors of said town of Porter, in answer to a petition signed by Daniel A. Rockwell have this day established and laid out a Private Road beginning at a point in the Madison and Janesville highway, 32 feet west, of East line of the $W\frac{1}{2}$ N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31 and along said East line of said land to the S. East corner of said $W\frac{1}{2}$ west half of the North East quarter N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 31; thence South along said line to the South line of the said town of Porter.

Notice to Discontinue Highway

Whereas, upon the application of 12 freeholders residing in said town of Porter for the discontinuing of a highway here in after described; we the undersigned Supervisors of said town did on the 14th day of September A.D. 1867 meet at the house of John L. Page in said town for the purpose of then and there deciding upon such application it being the time and place fixed by us for that purpose, did proceed to examine personally such highway and having then and there heard such reason as were offered for and against discontinuing the same did then and there decide upon such application and determine to discontinue said highway as hereinafter described; having as required by law, first made a notice and fixed therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application and the applicant for such highway having five days previous to our said meeting caused such notices to be duly given to all the occupants of the lands through which said highway passes and such notices having also been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting; it is ordered and determined and we do order and determine that the said highway being described as follows, to wit:
