Surveyed a Road in the town of Fulton Oct. 26 1852  
Rock County, Wisconsin.

Beginning at the North end of the bridge over the mill race;  
thence N. 15 W. 24, 6 chains; thence N. 4 E. 6 chains, 50  
links to N. 20, W. 7, 00 links; thence N. 3 W. 11, 05 links to a  
point on the line between Section 7 & 18 whole distance  
48 chains 55 links also surveyed on the same instant on  
the section line between sections 7 & 18 distance 80 chains  
70 links.

We the Supervisors of the Town of Fulton have this Oct. 25<sup>th</sup>  
1852 laid out and established a public highway according  
to the above survey and declare the same to be a public  
highway four rods wide.

We the Supervisors of the Town of Fulton, Rock County, Wis.  
do certify upon the application of six or more freeholders  
of said town asking for the laying out of a public Highway  
in said town. To wit: Commencing within about 20 rods of  
the S.W. corner of the N.E. 1/4 of Sec. 9 and running a little  
west of South to the corner of a Townsends field near  
his house; thence in a straight line of the best crossing of  
the ravine West of the lime kiln; thence the best and  
straightest route to intersect the main road at Phillip  
Davolts' Indian Ford. That we caused notice to be posted  
up in writing in three of the most public places in the  
town of Fulton specifying the road above mentioned proposed  
for a highway, and the time and place in which we would  
meet to make examination of the same which notices were  
posted up at least ten days before said meeting; and we do  
further certify that being fully satisfied that the notice  
required by law have been given pursuant to Statute; we on  
the 25<sup>th</sup> day of October 1852 it being the Specified time in said  
notice met at the hours and place therein named, examined  
and caused survey to be made of said proposed Highway which  
Survey will be found in Letter Book Page 75, heard all the  
reasons for and against laying out said Highway. We are of  
the opinion such Highway is necessary and proper and proceeded  
to lay out the same: and now therefore, we the Supervisors  
aforesaid in and for said Town do on this 25<sup>th</sup> day of October  
1852 order and declare the above road to be a public Highway  
4 rods wide and we do further order that the same be kept  
open as such pursuant statute and we do further certify  
that we have not assessed any damages to pay persons or persons  
and no person has any right to any damages from opening of said
