**Authorizing Submission of 2013 Edward Byrne
Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Application and
Authorizing Interagency Agreement with Beloit and Janesville**

1 **WHEREAS**, Rock County, the City of Beloit, and the City of Janesville are eligible, as a unit, to
2 apply for funds from the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG) for
3 the purpose of preventing and controlling crime, based on local needs and conditions; and,

5 **WHEREAS**, the U.S. Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs, Bureau of Justice
6 Assistance has determined that there is a funding disparity between the County and the Cities
7 based on the statutory JAG formula, and due to the disparity, the County and the Cities are
8 required to apply for the award with a single, joint application; and,

10 **WHEREAS**, the Rock County Sheriff, the Beloit Police Chief, and the Janesville Police Chief
11 plan to make a joint application in the amount of \$38,310; and,

13 **WHEREAS**, the municipalities have a written agreement that specifies the distribution of funds
14 as \$5,810 for Rock County, \$16,000 for Beloit, and \$16,500 for Janesville; and,

16 **WHEREAS**, the written agreement designates the Rock County Sheriff's Office as the grant
17 applicant and fiscal agent; and,

19 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly
20 assembled this 27 day of June, 2013, does hereby approve and authorize the
21 submission of an Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant application, and the Chair of
22 the Rock County Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to sign all necessary documents on
23 behalf of the County of Rock; and,


25 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Rock County Board of Supervisors and the
26 County Clerk are hereby directed to execute an Interagency Agreement with the City of Beloit
27 and the City of Janesville that designates Rock County as the grant fiscal agent and specifies
28 how grant proceeds will be shared should the application be funded.





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Executive Summary

Rock County, the City of Beloit, and the City of Janesville are eligible to apply for the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant, commonly referred to as JAG. Based on a formula funding disparity between the County and the Cities, the municipalities are required to apply for the award with a single, joint application.

The Rock County Sheriff's Office plans to apply for this grant in the amount of \$38,310. The Bureau of Justice Assistance will be making awards to assist local efforts to prevent or reduce crime and violence.

Rock County will act as the fiscal agent. The responsibilities of the fiscal agent include filing the application, administering and distributing the funds, monitoring the award, and submitting reports, performance measures, and program assessment data.

The grant application process requires an inter-agency agreement to be signed by each jurisdiction's authorized representative. The agreement specifies the fiscal agent and specifies the division of the grant proceeds. The proceeds will be divided as follows:

Beloit	\$ 16,000
Janesville	\$ 16,500
Rock County	\$ <u>5,810</u>
Total	\$ 38,310

The Sheriff's Office intends to purchase two radars and one preliminary breath test (PBT) device with their portion of the grant.

The grant application must be made available for the County Board to review before the application is submitted to BJA. The application will be made public, and an opportunity to comment will be provided to citizens.
