ESTABLISHING THE ROCK COUNTY COVID-19 EMERGENCY SMALL BUSINESS LOAN FUND

WHEREAS, the COVID-19 global pandemic has created severe economic hardships on the local, state and national economies; and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin and its counterparts throughout the nation have imposed mandated social distancing and safer at home policies as measures to protect the public's health by containing or curtailing the spread of the Coronavirus; and

WHEREAS, the implementation of these necessary policies has disrupted the economic repositioning, revitalization and resurgence that Rock County has experienced since recovering from the Great Recession; and

WHEREAS, these mandated public health policies are negatively impacting Rock County small businesses; and

WHEREAS, nearly 85% of the more than 3,370 businesses in Rock County are small businesses with less than 20 employees; and

WHEREAS, these small businesses need access to affordable and flexible capital to stabilize, sustain, strengthen or restart those operations impacted by COVID-19, and that said capital may serve as a bridge or conduit to secure longer-term, permanent sources of capital; and

WHEREAS, the County of Rock has a responsibility, as well as an opportunity, to assist the County's business community's recovery efforts during these extraordinary times; and

WHEREAS, the County Board of Supervisors has reviewed the need for a Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund and the countywide economic benefits gained therefrom.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this 9th day of april, 2020, authorizes and approves the formation of the Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund, in an amount of \$1,000,000 (One Million Dollars), and an administrative fund in the amount of \$50,000 that will be used to procure an administrative platform on which to apply for loans, to secure the services of experts who may be needed to provide supporting services, and other functions as approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the County Board Chair delegates the administrative, fiscal and program management of this Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund to the County's Planning, Economic and Community Development Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that program oversight, policy, and loan decision making authority be granted to a seven-member Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund Committee, consisting of four County Board Supervisors and three members of the public, all appointed by the Chair of the Rock County Board of Supervisors for a period of time deemed necessary to address, respond or recover from the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Emergency Small Business Loan Fund Committee is empowered to direct and approve expenditures from the Administrative Fund and, at its discretion, direct staff to develop an agreement with a third-party(s) to administer these funds on the County's behalf or for other services as needed.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the 2020 Planning and Development Department Budget be amended as follows:

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, social distancing and safer at home policies have negatively impacted the local, state and national economies. Consequently, communities across the nation are aggressively developing, replicating or reallocating funds to aid small businesses when and where appropriate. Therefore, the purpose of the Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund is to assist small businesses in Rock County that are experiencing documented financial difficulties that are directly attributed to the global COVID-19 pandemic.

While the program is open to all for-profit, private-sector businesses that are considered in good standing and not operating as home-based businesses, funding will be prioritized for service producing businesses – particularly those that are independent (i.e. non-franchise) and businesses that support the hospitality and business services sectors, respectively. Additional priority will be weighted toward businesses that are seeking bridge financing to help stabilize, sustain, strengthen or restart their operations.

Funding will be capped at \$20,000 per applicant; and it will be structured as a low-interest (i.e. one-percent), working capital loan. An appointed, seven member Rock County COVID-19 Emergency Small Business Loan Fund Committee will have program oversight, policy and loan decision making authority. Meanwhile, the County's Planning, Economic and Community Development Department will be responsible for providing administrative, fiscal and program management support.
