#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

At present, Rock County is a member of two Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreements: Marsh Country Health Alliance and Mississippi Valley Health Services Corporation. The Agreements allow Rock County to make residential placements in either Clearview in Juneau, WI or Lakeview Health Center in La Crosse, WI. Membership gives Rock County the option to make placements as members of the Consortium for between \$45-\$50/day over and above the Medical Assistance for those skilled nursing home facilities. At times, those facilities are near capacity and a bed may not be available should Rock County be required to place an individual.

It would be advantageous for Rock County to join the Woodland Enhanced Health Services (WEHS) Commission as a regular full consortium member so that we may place Rock County residents in the Clark County Health Care Center (CCHCC) in Neilsville, WI. The CCHCC, through the WEHS, gives Rock County another placement alternative to Clearview and Lakeview and the daily rate of pay over and above the Medical Assistance daily rate is \$46.25. Under the current agreement, as a WEHS Associate Member, the daily rate is twice that amount or \$92.50/day. Furthermore, CCHCC takes more medically and behaviorally challenging individuals who are very difficult to place. This is a better alternative than inappropriately continuing an individual in one of the State Institutes at a significantly higher cost. Sufficient funding exists in the Crisis, other contracted services, to pay this one time cost.


#### **Executive Summary for the Purchase of Network Servers**

As part of the 2014 Land Records IT budget and the 2014 IT Capital Projects budget, this purchase will replace two aging application servers used by the County's GIS users, three aging general application servers, and two servers to be used for the County's new email system. The server purchase includes:

- 7 Cisco UCS physical Blade Servers for hosting the above mentioned applications;
- 1 Cisco Blade Server Enclosure;
- Redundant power supplies and fans;
- 1 Data Center rack for mounting the Server Enclosure;
- All associated cables, and
- Installation and first year's maintenance and support.

The Blade Server Enclosure and the servers will be located in the data center at the Health Care Center. They will be network-attached and will use the County's Storage Area Network for primary disk storage. These servers will have a useful life to the County of 5-7 years.

### Executive Summary – Deputy Sheriff's 2013-2014 Agreement

### Wages:

Since the parties were not able to reach a voluntary agreement on wages and other terms for a 2013 agreement, a State mediator from the WERC was asked to work with the parties. After meeting with each side and listing to their issues, the mediator suggested the structure for a settlement. As a result of his suggestion the parties were able to agree on this settlement which was approved by the Deputy Sheriff's Association.

The proposed wage settlement for 2013 represents an across the board wage increase of 1.5% effective January 1, 2013. This is done by increasing each step in each range in the Detective classification (C, D, E, and F) and the Deputy Sheriff classification (A, B, C, D, E, and F) by 1.5%.

The proposed wage settlement for 2014 is equivalent to the cost of a 1.5% across the board increase effective January 1, 2014. However the increase is not the same for each range and step. The 2014 salary grid was constructed by increasing each step in each range in the Detective classification (C, D, E, and F) and the Deputy Sheriff classification (A, B, C, D, E, and F) by 1%. The difference between increasing each range and step by 1.5% and 1.0% was then calculated. The difference between 1.5% and 1% was then applied equally to the top range (F) in the Detective classification and the top range in the Deputy Sheriff classification (F). This amount was calculated to be 42 cents. So 42 cents was added to each step in the F ranges. This means that the increase for the Detectives in Range F and the Deputy Sheriffs in Range F effective January 1, 2014 are between 2.2% and 2.4%, whereas the raises for everyone else are 1%.

- Employees are normally hired at Step A of the Deputy Sheriff's grid.
- Employees are advanced to Step B upon completion of twelve months of service (1 year).
- Employees are advanced to Step C upon completion of twenty-four months of service (2 years).
- Employees are advanced to Step D upon completion of forty-eight months of service (4 years).
- Employees are advanced to Step E upon completion of one hundred-eight months of service (9 years).
- Employees are advanced to Step F upon completion of one-hundred sixty-eight months of service (14 years).

### Vacation

6.03 Employees hired after February 1, 2002 shall be entitled to annual paid vacation as follows: upon the completion of one year, ten working days. 7.04 <u>Funeral Leave.</u> In the event of a death in an employee's immediate family, absence of no more than three days may be allowed without loss of pay in conjunction with attendance at the funeral. In the event of the death of a brother in law or sister in law, absence of no more than one day may be allowed without loss of pay to attend the funeral.

Bereavement Leave. In the event of a death in an employee's immediate family, he/she may be excused from work without loss of pay according to the following schedule to attend the

funeral, make necessary arrangements, or grieve for the loved one. Immediate family shall not include former "in-laws" due to divorce. The Department may require an obituary to substantiate the leave.

#### FISCAL NOTE:

The purpose of this resolution is to authorize expenditures from the 2014 deferred finance budget appropriations prior to actual debt issuance. The 2014 budgeted capital projects are estimated to cost \$5,970,000 (plus issuance costs) for Highway Road Construction Capital Projects. If the County adopts this resolution, the project costs and issuance costs will be included in a subsequent resolution that authorizes the issuance of General Obligation Bonds and/or Notes.

1993 Wisconsin Act 16 (the State Budget Bill) established property tax levy rate limits for Wisconsin Counties, beginning with the 1993 payable 1994 levy. The Wisconsin Department of Revenue's Administrative Rules authorize an increase in the debt levy rate under certain conditions, including resolutions authorizing debt issuance that are adopted by affirmative vote of at least three-fourths of the members of the County Board. The County Board may also approve the issuance of debt by adopting a resolution which provides a reasonable expectancy that the new debt will not cause the County to increase its debt levy rate. It is my opinion that the debt amortization that would be incurred upon issuance of debt for the projects included in this resolution would not exceed Rock County's debt levy rate as limited by Wisconsin Act 16.

Pursuant to sec. 67.05(10), Stats., the County Board, before issuing any contemplated long-term debt, must adopt a resolution levying a direct, annual tax sufficient in an amount to pay for the express purpose of paying the interest on such bonds as it falls due, and also to pay and discharge the principal thereof at maturity. That will happen at a later date.

A majority vote is necessary to adopt this resolution. However, a three-fourths vote of the "members-elect" would avoid any potential issue relative to the debt levy rate limit.
