Amending the 2020 Human Services Department Budget to Accept Supplemental Funding for the Coordinated Services Team (CST)

Rock County Human Services Department has been awarded additional Coordinated Services Team (CST) grant dollars from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services in the amount of \$12,037 to be used by September 30, 2020. This resolution seeks approval from the Board to accept the grant award.

The additional grant funding will be used for supporting basic family needs and running a youth group. Due to the pandemic, family need requests have increased, so these will help meet those demands. In addition, funding will be used to train CPS staff in a teaming model (Coordinated Services Team) to support the work involved in helping families find permanency and coordinating care.

Coordinated Services Teams (CST) more often referred to as wraparound care is a teaming model to help youth and families develop a comprehensive, individualized plan of care to treat complex behavioral health needs. The CST itself is a group that includes family members, service providers, and others that work to design and carry out a coordinated services plan for the child. The result is a plan of care that addresses the needs of the child and family with community-based supports, which allows the child to live in their home and community.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution authorizes the Rock County Land Conservation Committee to submit an application to the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) for Clean Sweep grants in 2021 for Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) and Ag. The Land Conservation Committee sponsored the last Clean Sweep Program in 2020. The Health Department applies for a prescription drug collection grant independently of this application.

The Clean Sweep Program provides affordable and safe disposal of unwanted hazardous chemicals to county residents, eligible businesses, and units of government at two to three drop-offs events per year in Rock County. Chemicals banned from disposal in the landfill system will be collected through this program.

The application period for the 2021 program year is now open and closes September 28, 2020. A presumed award amount of \$5,500 has been included in preliminary budget preparation documents. The combined HHW and Ag grants make up approximately 15% of the program's annual budget with the balance coming from annual voluntary contributions from cities, villages, towns, and County ATC funds.

This is a reimbursement grant that requires a 25% local match of the final award as cash and/or in-kind. The County intends to meet the 25% match with the activities associated with this event including contracted vendor services at drop-off events and outreach to the public on hazardous waste.

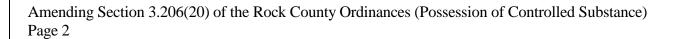

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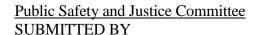

Executive Summary

On April 9, 2020, in Resolution 20-4A-447, the Rock County Board of Supervisors authorized the Sheriff's Office to submit the Bureau of Justice Assistance Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program grant. The Body-Worn Camera Policy and Implementation Program is intended to support a law enforcement agency's plans for implementing a comprehensive body-worn camera program.

The Sheriff's Office expects to receive notification of whether it will be awarded this grant by October 2020. This resolution authorizes the Sheriff's Office to accept the grant and, if awarded, to amend the 2020 budget by making a \$40,000 application from the General Fund to serve as the required local match. Approving this resolution now will reduce the time on the back end required for the Sheriff's Office to proceed with making purchases of body cameras and related equipment. If the grant is not awarded, no General Fund application will be made.

The description of the grant from Resolution 20-4A-447 is below:

The grant funds must be used for the purchase of body-worn cameras and for program implementation. The full implementation may include related equipment and officer training. Data storage costs are specifically excluded from the grant.

The Rock County Sheriff's Office plans to apply for the grant in the amount of \$40,000. The grant requires a one to one match. The match amount will be \$40,000. The implementation portion of the project will be \$80,000. The match may be a cash (hard) match or an in-kind match.

The Sheriff's Office intends to use a hard match. The match funding will come from the General Fund.

The grant budget will be fully developed during the application process. The draft grant budget is as follows.

The City of Janesville is expecting 25,000 absentee ballots. Using the current equipment available, the City of Janesville has calculated that they will need over 35 hours to process the absentee ballots and an increased number of poll workers to handle the processing.

ES&S Election System and Software has high speed scanner compatible with the current election equipment used throughout Rock County. The DS450 High Speed Scanner-Tabulator processes 72/ballots per minutes. The current tabulators used at the polling locations are hand feed one ballot at time. The maximum speed to scan one ballot is eight seconds.

The purchased equipment would be used at Janesville's Central Count location where all absentee ballots for the city are counted. Extra machines that would have been used at Central Count would be allocated to other parts of the county to help with their records numbers of absentee ballots.

The high speed tabulator would lessen the number of poll workers needed to process absentee ballots and allow for more social distancing to help protect our poll workers from COVID-19.

Executive Summary

The ongoing COVID-19 Pandemic has shown that Rock County should alter the equipment that is deployed to County staff. At the beginning of the Pandemic, 100 laptops were deployed to County staff as they began to work from home. These laptops had originally been purchased to replace laptops that had reached end-of-life. What the Pandemic has taught us is that our equipment needs to be flexible enough to support workers both in and out of the office. Due to the current amounts of County owned laptops, many County staff are using their own personal computers to continue to work.

Rock County Information Technology has reviewed current computer inventory to determine where a laptops is a better choice of computer over a desktop. This strategy also aligns us with the industry trend that allows for a more remote workforce. This plan, along with the investments already made into our Citrix infrastructure gives departments more flexibility on how they allow their staff to work.

In addition, upcoming changes to the County network with recently purchased Cisco equipment will allow staff with laptops to connect to the County network in the same manner as they do from their office.

Funding from the CARES Act will offset the costs of migrating from desktops to laptops.

The laptops are available from CDW-G, Inc. under state Contract #MNNVP-133 505ENT-O16-NASP.

This resolution authorizes Rock County Information Technology to 369 Laptops and components from CDW-G, Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$494,530.11

Executive Summary

RECLASSIFICATION OF A 1.0 FTE ACCOUNT CLERK II POSITION TO ACCOUNT CLERK –HSD

The Human Services Department is requesting a reclassification of a 1.0 FTE Account Clerk II position to an Account Clerk - HSD. The Department currently has 6.0 FTE Account Clerk - HSD (2489 Range 6) and 1.0 FTE Vacant Account Clerk II (2489 Range 7) positions.

HSD is requesting the reclassification of the Account Clerk II position as staff will be performing similar and the same functions as other Account Clerk HSDs. This position will perform general accounting duties which include processing, recording, and summarizing financial information for both internal and external consumers. This position will have duties primarily related to the Children's Long Term Support program.

The pay range will change from 2489 Range 7 to 2489 Range 6. This is a \$787 annual cost difference and will be covered with savings from the position being vacant for most of the year.
