REPEALING ROCK COUNTY SMOKING ORDINANCE 3.701 AND ADOPTING WISCONSIN STATEWIDE SMOKE FREE AIR LAW

1 2	WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has adopted a new statewide smoke free air law pursuant to section 101.123, Wis. Stats.; and
3 4 5	WHEREAS, Rock County has reviewed its current ordinance and has made the following changes.
6 7 8 9	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Rock County Board of Supervisors in session this day of, 2012, that Section 3.701 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:
10 11 12	3.701 SMOKING IN CERTAIN PLACES PROHIBITED
13 14	(1) Authority. This Ordinance is adopted under the authority granted by § 101.123, Wis. Stats. as may be amended.
15 16 17	(2) Purpose. The purpose of this Ordinance is to promote the health and comfort of the public and Rock County employees.
18 19 20	(3) Definitions. As used in this Section.
21 22 23	(a) "Assisted Living Facility" means a community-based residential facility, as defined in Sec. 50.01(1g), Wis. Stats., a residential care apartment complex, as defined in Sec. 50.01(1d), Wis. Stats. or an adult family home as defined in Sec. 50.01(1)(b), Wis. Stats.
24 25 26	(b) "Building" means any enclosed, indoor area of a structure owned by the County or any enclosed, indoor area of that part of a structure leased by the County.
27 28 29	(c) "County-owned" means any buildings, as defined in this Section, owned by the County.
30 31	(d) "County-leased" means any part of a building, as defined in this Section, which is leased by the County.
32 33 34 35	(e) "Enclosed Indoor Area" means all space between a floor and a ceiling that is bounded by walls, doors, or windows, whether opened or closed, covering more than fifty percent (50%) of the combined surface area of the vertical planes constituting the perimeter of the area.
36 37 38 39	(f) "Entrance" means a doorway which gives direct access to a building from a contiguous street, plaza, sidewalk or parking lot, opened windows, and any building ventilation systems.
40 41 42	(g) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying any lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, electronic cigarette or any other lighted smoking equipment in any manner or in any form.
43 44 45	(h) "Vehicle" means any automobile, truck, or other motorized piece of equipment owned, leased, or operated by the county.

- (i) "Workplace" means any enclosed indoor area that employees normally frequent during 47 the course of employment, including an office, a work area, an elevator, an employee lounge, a 48 restroom, a conference room, a meeting room, a classroom, a hallway, a stairway, a lobby, a common 49 area, a vehicle, a storage area, or an employee cafeteria. A private residence shall not be considered a 50 place of employment unless it is used as a child care, adult day care, or health care facility.
 - (3) Smoking Prohibited.

- (a) No person shall smoke in any County-owned or County-leased building, work place or vehicle at any time.
- (b) Smoking is prohibited within thirty (30) feet of any entrance of a county-owned or county-leased building, or workplace.
- (c) No person shall smoke within the buildings, within thirty (30) feet of any building, or within designated non-smoking areas of the campus grounds, at UW-Rock County.
 - (d) No person shall smoke within the building or the campus area of Rock Haven.
 - 1. The "campus of Rock Haven" shall be defined for the purpose of this ordinance as those areas, both indoors and outdoors, falling within the perimeter of the campus boundary surrounding the skilled nursing facility building at Rock Haven.
- (4) Exceptions. The prohibition in Subsection (3) shall not apply to the following structures or the following areas:
- (a) County-owned or County-leased residential rooms in assisted living facilities, which are designated smoking as defined in §§ 101.123(3)(i) and 101.123(3)(j), Wis. Stats.
- (b) Private residences in buildings owned or leased by Rock County, unless the building is otherwise designated as smoke free.
 - (c) Outside smoking areas, designated and approved by the County Board.
- (5) Responsibilities. The County shall post signs prohibiting smoking at least thirty (30) feet 81 from the public entrance of County-owned and County-leased buildings and work places. The signs shall be: (a) of uniform dimensions and other characteristics required under § 101.123(2m), Wis. Stats., specified by § 101.123(6), Wis. Stats.; (b) be posted at doorway entrances of county-owned and county-leased buildings, and work places.
 - (6) Penalties and Enforcement.
- 88 (a) Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, 89 forfeit not less than \$100.00, nor more than \$250.00 for each violation together with the costs of 90 prosecution and forfeiture.
 - (7) Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be full force and effect as of May 13, 2013.

Executive Summary

Amending the Sheriff's 2013 Budget to Use Equitably Shared Funds for Avatar II Tactical Robot

The Department of Justice Asset Forfeiture Program is a nationwide law enforcement initiative that removes the tools of crime from criminal organizations and deprives wrongdoers of the proceeds of their crimes. Federal law authorizes the Attorney General to share federally forfeited property with participating state and local law enforcement agencies.

Equitably shared funds are required to be used by law enforcement agencies for law enforcement purposes only. The intent of the transfer is to enhance law enforcement. It must increase, not supplant the recipient's appropriated operating budget.

For their participation in the program, and through the efforts of the Special Investigations Unit (SIU) and the Detective Bureau, the Sheriff's Office received funds in the amount of \$20,520.00. The Sheriff's Office plans to spend \$20,520.00 of equitably shared funds to purchase an Avatar II tactical robot from Pro-Tech of Berea, OH. A letter from the manufacturer, RoboteX, Inc. is attached. The letter states that Pro-Tech is the sole source supplier of this technology.



The AVATAR II is a rugged, easy-to-use tactical robot that enhances the capabilities of law enforcement and first-responders by allowing them to safely and quickly inspect dangerous situations. It climbs stairs, and it has video and two-way audio.

The AVATAR II is available with several different options. We have selected the base package which includes two cameras and a spare battery. The first camera is placed in the body in front of the AVATAR II and shows the operator where the AVATAR II is going. The second camera is a Pan Tilt Zoom camera that has infrared capabilities. This camera can rotate 360 degrees to allow the operator to see in all directions. The AVATAR II has an internal microphone and speaker that allows the operator to listen and deliver commands if needed. High angle stabilizers are an option that we have added to the AVATAR II. These stabilizers allow the AVATAR II to climb up over steep inclines and tall objects. An external audio/video receiver is another option that was selected. This will allow command staff in the command center to be able to view in real time what the AVATAR II is viewing. The AVATAR II is also able to record what the cameras are viewing. An ultra-durable carrying case was also selected so we will be able to store and transport the AVATAR II in a secure manner.

The AVATAR II would be used in tactical situations where an armed person is hiding a building and refusing to come out. The AVATAR II would be sent in to the building to locate the armed subject before a K9 or Deputies were sent in. Once the AVATAR II locates the suspect, Command can devise better tactical plans to resolve the situation. Often times the suspect will surrender to the AVATAR II.

The AVATAT II provides real time intelligence to the SWAT Team and Command while limiting the SWAT Team's exposure to danger.

The Rock County surveying department is responsible for the database maintenance and remonumentation of the Public Land Survey System, (PLSS), in Rock County. The findings, information and data produced provide the framework for the County Geographic Information System, (GIS). The GIS is critical to other County departments and continuing to provide accurate Wisconsin County Coordinates, Rock datum, is a priority of this office. Additionally, private users, including residents, land owners and professionals offering services in the County regularly access the GIS information available via the internet and records for which I am the custodian. Efficiently fulfilling the statutory obligations of the office and providing information and services critical for others now and into the future is incumbent upon the County surveyor. Working in conjunction with administration, finance and purchasing, I have assessed the needs of the department and identified cost-saving measures that permit the purchase of modern equipment and software. 



Executive Summary Authorizing Lease and Partnership Agreement, with the Friends of Beckman Mill, Incorporated

Rock County has acquired several parcels over the years now known as Beckman Mill County Park. Via the grant process, funding for these acquisitions was obtained: 50% from the LAWCON program, various wildlife programs with local matching funding from the County Board.

The park is open, developed and maintained for the public via operational funding by Rock County.

This contract is our next 10-year partnership agreement with FBM, Inc. In 1991, the first agreement was entered into between Rock County and FBM. The second 10-year partnership agreement provides for a continued partnership for the next 10 years. FBM will continue to operate and maintain the historic Beckman Mill, dam and fish passage on the west fork of Raccoon Creek and the creamery/visitor center, and blacksmith shop (except for the public toilets maintained by Rock County).

At the present time, the current lease is due for renewal. This lease updates the exhibits and modifies some of the agreement elements to reflect actual operations.

This resolution is to provide a long-term agreement with the Friends of Beckman Mill, Incorporated (FBM), to fund, operate, maintain and program the Beckman Mill Museum Complex on approximately two acres of park land.

The agreement has also received approval from the DNR.

FBM is incorporated in the State of Wisconsin and has federal 501(3)(c) tax exempt status.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

After the 2008 flood, Rock County used Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) grant funds to acquire several damaged properties on the Rock River flood plain. FEMA required that deed restrictions be attached to these properties to prohibit any structures and limit the property use to open space or a public use such as parkland. Rock County was further barred from transferring these properties to any group other than another public entity or a qualified conservation organization.

In the Spring of 2012, Rock County staff discussed possible property uses with the County Board Staff Committee, Planning and Development Committee, and the Public Works Committee. These committees agreed that the County would investigate transfer options for any properties unsuitable for a County park. It was determined that given its small size (1 acre), limited potential uses, distance from other County parks, and expenses related to maintenance and upkeep, the property at 3636 West Cemetery Road in the Town of Rock would be an excellent transfer candidate.

The City of Janesville owns an adjacent parcel of parkland and wrote a letter expressing interest in this property. Pending City Council action, the City of Janesville intends to use the land as a public open space, a canoe put in and take out area, and as a connector between the Janesville bike path and a planned route to Beloit. This use would comply with the property deed restrictions. The Rock Trail Coalition has offered to adopt and take care of grounds maintenance, such as mowing and litter collection, at this property.

In addition to Janesville City Council and Rock County Board action, the FEMA Regional Administrator must also approve this transfer for it to be considered final.

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY -

Design is progressing on the CTH G Mega Projects between Huebbe Parkway in Beloit to STH 11 (West) in Janesville. Federal and State funds are being received to pay for the construction of these projects. Federal and State Laws require that all new highway projects using their respective funds shall include bicycle and pedestrian accommodations.


The State of Wisconsin Administrative Code, TRANS 75, outlines requirements for these bike and pedestrian accommodations. That code also offers several exclusions, if certain criteria are met. One of these exclusions is "absence of need." When one of these exclusions is granted, the State still maintains the authority to expect installation of accommodations in the future, if the criteria are no longer met.

Bicycle accommodations are being provided along the whole project and are not the subject of this resolution.

This resolution identifies areas where pedestrian accommodations are and are not needed. In some areas, there will be sidewalk on both sides of the roadway. Other sections will have sidewalk on only one side, east or west side. Still other sections will have no sidewalks at all.

The resolution makes the required commitment by the County to installing these omitted facilities in the future as development occurs. It is the County's intent that these future costs be bourn by the adjoining land owners as development occurs. Further, the resolution asks for the exemptions on the basis of "absence of need."

A sketch showing the areas of pedestrian accommodation is attached herewith.

While approximately 400 animals bite people each year in Rock County, many more animal bites go undocumented. Only 50% of cats and dogs in the documented animal bites are vaccinated for rabies. Declaring Rock County Rabies Awareness Week will alert the community to this public health concern. Keeping your pet current on their rabies vaccinations is being a responsible pet owner and protects both your family and your pet.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 1973, the Retired & Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) was founded. Since that time, the collective efforts of RSVP are impressive:

- 4,617,107 cumulative hours of volunteer service
- More than 800 active volunteers
- More than 100 children per year served by the Intergenerational Program
- Nearly 2,000 hand made items (mittens, hats, baby blankets) produced and distributed to the Rock County community

In addition, RSVP has worked closely with Rock County to provide important services to residents. In 2001, RSVP began staffing the information desk in the main lobby of the Rock County Courthouse. These volunteers assist residents who may need directions or have questions about available County services. In 2011, RSVP also began operating the Seniors Helping Seniors program, which replaced the Senior Companion Program. This program provides door through door transportation, meaning not only from the home to the destination, but also assisting the older person while at the destination. This program serves approximately 300 people per year and volunteers have logged more than 95,000 miles since the program's inception.
