10.A. Health Department Annual Report.

Karen Cain, Director/Health Officer for Rock County, presented the annual report for 2012. The entire report can be viewed online at www.co.rock.wi.us or by requesting at the Rock County Clerk's office: 51 S. Main Street, Janesville, WI 53545. (608)757-5660.

Karen began by thanking the Board for their financial support to do the services that the Health Department provides. She thanked the Board of Health Supervisors, Kraft, Peer, Bostwick and Rundle for the time they commit to keeping the Health Department running.

Since 1900, public health is credited to adding 25 years of life to the average citizen, and yet the average citizen probably does not know what the Health Department does in its entirety. In addition to health education and vaccinations, the Health Department aids the community in the areas of:

- Environmental health & safety (swimming pools, brownfield site management, disposal of unwanted and expired medications, sampling licensed beaches, lakes and streams)
- Recreational health & safety (inspecting local campgrounds, swimming pools and beaches)
- Community health & safety (improvements to housing and areas surrounding our homes such as mold and radon elimination, timely disposal of refuse, insect and rodent prevention, rabies and animal bite monitoring, human health hazard investigation, tattoo and body piercing establishment inspections, lead abatement and monitoring)
- Private sewage disposal

- Ground water program (every resident of Rock County depends on a daily source of clean drinking water and in Wisconsin, groundwater is our sole water supply source.)
- Laboratory services (testing of drinking water, private wells)
- Emergency planning
- Food protection and public lodging program (routine inspection of over 700 full service food facilities and 78 temporary food operations, inspection of senior citizen nutrition facility, food safety awareness and education programs)

Ms. Cain focused her report on four areas but encouraged the Board to review the complete report as it is quite comprehensive. She cited four of more than 100 health department achievements as immunizations, control of communicable diseases, safe and healthier foods, and maternal and child health. The Rock County Health Department served 5,196 people with immunizations in 2012 and gave 8,604 vaccines.

Communicable Disease control is a state-mandated public health service. Preventing the occurrence of all disease, which can be prevented by immunizations is one way the Health department seeks to prevent and control. Controlling the spread of more than 80 plus reportable acute and communicable diseases by prompt investigation and community education is the other. While there are many strategies implemented by the Health Department to reduce and limit transmission of communicable diseases, ten specific objectives were targeted for 2012 and the results can be viewed in the full report.

The Healthy Families First Home Visiting Program is a voluntary service offered to women and families. Pregnancy and parenting is a time of great transition and not all women are referred for services agree to ongoing visits. The agency is working on a strategic plan to outreach to local providers and inform them of the services available to Rock County families. The goals of the Rock County Healthy Families First program are to: Promote positive health behaviors; reduce the risks associated with reproductive health of mothers and families; promote growth, development, and optimal functioning of infants, children and youth; and reduce racial disparity in birth outcome to prevent injury and disability.
