Repealing Rock County Ordinance 3.104(1) and Repealing and Recreating Rock County Ordinance 3.212

"The Rock County Board of Supervisors at its regular meeting this	day of
, 2014, does ordain as follows:	

- I. Section 3.104(1) Regulations as to Parking at County buildings in Beloit is hereby repealed.
- II. Section 3.212 of the Rock County Code of Ordinances is hereby repealed and recreated to read as follows:

3.212 Shining Animals; Possession of Live Wild Animals

(1) Section 39.314 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 2011-2012 and as may be thereafter amended is adopted by reference hereby as if set forth in full. It is intended that this ordinance shall strictly conform to the Wisconsin Statutes. Whenever this ordinance and the statutes conflict, the statutes shall control.

- (2) Section 169.04 of the Wisconsin Statutes of 2011-2012 and as may be thereafter amended is adopted by reference hereby as if set forth in full. It is intended that this ordinance shall strictly conform to the Wisconsin Statutes. Whenever this ordinance and the statutes conflict, the statutes shall control.
- (3) Penalty. A person who violates any of the provision of this ordinance shall be, upon conviction, subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$1,000.
- III. Section 3.212 shall be effective upon publication."

Supervisor Knudson moved approval of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Fell. ADOPTED.
