This will confirm the County Administrator's offer of employment to you of the position Rock Haven Nursing Home Administrator. This appointment is contingent on confirmation of the County Board of Supervisors. We anticipate this will occur on April 25, 2013. This offer is based on the following conditions:

- Date of Employment: May 28, 2013.
- Salary: \$43.53 per hour/\$90,890.64 annually (Step 3, Pay Range 35). This pay range may go up in late April or the first part of May by 1.5% so the annual salary, if approved by the County Board, would be approximately \$92,248.
- Fringe Benefits: All benefits granted employees covered by the Unilateral Pay Plan in accordance with the Rock County Personnel Ordinance with the exception of vacation.
- As discussed, the County Administrator is willing to give you an additional 7.5 days of vacation to be used in your first year after working with the County for six months. Due to a previously pre-scheduled five day vacation during the first week of August where you will not be able to communicate by cell phone, you will be allowed to use 3 of these 7.5 days and 2 days of leave without pay to cover that vacation.

I would appreciate receiving a written acceptance of this offer under the above conditions at your earliest convenience. I hope you enjoy your new position with Rock County and look forward to working with you.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Resolution #12-8A-084 authorized spending \$50,000 of Equitably Shared funds for a K-9 vehicle to be used by the Rock County Sheriff's Office. These funds were carried over from the 2012 budget to the 2013 budget.

Under Section 19.08(4) of the Purchasing Ordinance, Rock County can utilize State of Wisconsin bids to purchase vehicles through cooperative purchasing agreement #15-07006-201.

The Sheriff's Office and the Purchasing Staff reviewed the State of Wisconsin bid specifications to verify that they meet the Sheriff's Office's needs. The total cost breakdown for the vehicle is as follows:

\$22,979.50 1 Dodge Charger

The remainder of the funds will be used to outfit the squad with necessary equipment such as, but not limited to, dog enclosure, lights, siren, push bumper, computer, radar, shot gun, radio, scanner, and decals.

This squad is an addition to the fleet. There will not be a trade-in.

1 2	WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin has adopted a new statewide smoke free air law pursuant to section 101.123, Wis. Stats.; and

36 37 38 39	(f) "Entrance" means a doorway which gives direct access to a building from a contiguous street, plaza, sidewalk or parking lot, opened windows, and any building ventilation systems.
40 41 42	(g) "Smoking" means inhaling, exhaling, burning or carrying any lighted cigar, cigarette, pipe, electronic cigarette or any other lighted smoking equipment in any manner or in any form.
