Department Reports

Medicaid Transportation Report – Justin Svingen Mr. Svingen spoke of the trouble interacting with the statewide Medicaid Transportation provider, MTM. He stated that complaints are still coming in. For example, clients are receiving phone calls 5 minutes prior to their scheduled pickup time informing them of canceled rides or not showing up. The clients are missing medical appointments and are trying to reach out and find their own transportation. Specialized Transit is receiving calls for transportation from MA-eligible clients who are paying "out of pocket" because they are frustrated with MTM. Mr. Svingen said MTM receives \$50 million dollars per year whether they pick up clients or not. This is a federally funded program. Mr. Svingen said advocacy groups have been trying to get an audit completed on this program and have been unsuccessful. He said the Milwaukee Journal has been following this story. Ideas regarding what the Committee can do were discussed and suggestions were brought up regarding a resolution to be drawn up to go before County Board Staff and County Board for their upcoming meetings on March 25th and March 27th.
