#### **Executive Summary**

The Wisconsin Department of Justice was awarded \$506,323 (\$42,500 Sheriff's Office portion) from the US Department of Justice to resolve homicide cold cases in Wisconsin. The award will fund efforts in the Division of Criminal Investigation, the Division of Law Enforcement Services, the Rock County Sheriff's Office, the Dane County Sheriff's Office, the Madison Police Department, and the Dane County Coroner's Office.

The funding will be used to provide overtime funds for full time detectives to devote time to cold case investigations. Investigators will partner with experts in DNA forensics, prosecution, victim/witness services, coroners, crime analysts and academic researchers to bring a well-rounded approach and fresh perspective to these challenging cases.

The Rock County Sheriff's Office is considered a consultant in this project. The Sheriff's Office is eligible to receive \$40,500 for overtime wages and \$2,000 for training under this grant. The County will be responsible for the cost of benefits and supplies.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A LAKE MANAGEMENT PROTECTION GRANT FOR SHORELAND ZONING ORDINANCE DEVELOPMENT

In February 1, 2010, revised Shoreland Zoning rules went into effect in Wisconsin through the amendment of Chapter NR 115 Wisconsin Administrative Code. These revisions are a result of a multi-year process of public comments, hearings and modifications conducted in an effort to balance the public purpose of shoreland zoning with property rights of landowners.

Wisconsin counties are required to adopted and enforce shoreland zoning regulations to "further the maintenance of safe and healthful conditions; prevent and control water pollution; protect spawning grounds, fish and aquatic life; control building sites, placement of structures and land uses and reserve shore cover and natural beauty." Rock County has enforced a shoreland zoning ordinance, with amendments, since 1983. The revision to the state code requires counties to adopt the amendments by February 1, 2012.

The Department Natural Resources (DNR) provides grant funding though the Lake Protection Grant Program for ordinance development. Grant awards in the amount of \$5000 maximum are available for counties who choose to amend their ordinance to meet minimum standards. This is a reimbursement grant program consisting of a 75% state cost-share, which will require the county to provide at least \$1667.00 in local match for a total minimum project cost of \$6667.00 in order to receive the full grant amount. Rock County Planning and Development Agency staff intends to complete this project with existing staff and resources (which may be considered the local match), including conducting public education, without exceeding this cost.

The Rock County Board of Supervisors authorized the Rock County Planning and Development Agency to submit a grant application on April 14, 2011, which was subsequently approved for funding as part of the state biennial budget process. The project period is July 1, 2011 to December 31, 2012. In order to accept the award, a final agreement must be signed and returned to the DNR.

By the proposed action, the Rock County Board of Supervisors authorizes the Rock County Planning and Development Agency, through Paul Benjamin, Director, to sign the grant agreement to accept the partial funding for the required shoreland ordinance amendments. Approval of the resolution also amends the 2011 County Budget to accept these funds.

COR # 104 pertains to Proposal Request # 23, Glazing at existing pods.

Proposal Request # 23 directs the replacement of existing tinted security glass with clear security glass at the existing pod control areas. The glass replacement was part of the original scope of work that was omitted when the project was scaled back to eliminate renovation of the existing pod controls walls.

With the addition of the mirrored glass in the dayrooms, the tinted glass in the pod controls reduces visibility for the Correctional officers more than anticipated. The combination of clear glass in pod controls, lighting adjustments in the corridors, and mirrored glass at the dayrooms, will allow Correctional officers the ability to monitor inmates while preventing inmates from monitoring and reacting to activities in the pod controls.

#### Executive Summary for the Purchase of Network Infrastructure Equipment

As a Capital Improvement Program project, this project is focused on improving the County's network infrastructure for the purpose of delivering faster network speeds and enhancing network security for all County systems and users. After installation of the network components, County users will notice markedly better system response times, and more refined network security features will be implemented.

The purchase is for 25 Cisco network switches and associated components.

These network infrastructure items will replace equipment that is now over 11 years old and no longer capable of providing the desired level of network throughput, functionality, and security. The replacement switches are projected to have a similar life-span of approximately 10 years.

The replacement switches will be located throughout all County facilities.

The network infrastructure equipment will cost \$103,894.00 and be purchased from Core BTS using the pricing and terms of the State of Wisconsin contract #15-20664-501.

#### **Executive Summary**

Resolution Awarding Contract for Parking Lot Expansion and Maintenance at UW-Rock County

The demand for parking has increased to the point where a new 100 car parking lot has been designed for the south end of the campus. In addition to the new parking lot, repairs are needed to existing parking areas, drives and sidewalks.

The specifications split the work into three parts as follows:

Base Bid – Covers all the work to build a new 100 car parking lot south of the existing parking lots. The old tennis courts will be removed prior to preparing the base.

Alternate Bid #1 – Covers repairs to the existing parking lots and drives. Due to the fact funds would not cover all the repair work needed, only the worst areas will be repaired. Bidders were given specific quantities of square yards, linear feet, etc, in order to determine a cost. These same unit prices will be used to calculate the cost of additional work deemed necessary.

Alternate Bid #2 – Covers sidewalk removal and replacement in select areas. The cracked or deteriorated cement sections were outlined on a site plan in order that a total price could be calculated. The bidders were asked for a unit price in the event additional sidewalk replacement is necessary.

The contractor anticipates completing the work on September 6<sup>th</sup>, which corresponds with the start of classes on the Campus.

The \$10,000.00 contingency will be used to cover additional work as deemed necessary using unit pricing provided on the bid form.

#### AUTHORIZING APPLICATION WITH WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR COUNTY FISH AND GAME PROJECT GRANT FUNDS

Each Wisconsin County is allocated a certain amount of money annually to fund small projects on a 50/50 match basis. Rock County may apply for a maximum of \$1,927 in 2012. Parks plans to access this funding source to help pay for invasive species control at Carver-Roehl Park. Though this funding source requires a 50% match by the County, all time and materials supplied by the Parks and Highway Divisions, as well as other community resources, may be used as in-kind match. The Friends of Carver-Roehl and local volunteers have assisted with this project in the past and have expressed a strong interest in continuing the effort.

The species to be controlled using this grant is garlic mustard. For the past few years, we have used these funds for garlic mustard control in Carver-Roehl Park, and we're starting to achieve a noticeable reduction of the invasive species. However, we still have a long way to go in eradicating this invasive in Carver-Roehl, so it is imperative that we continue these control efforts at Carver-Roehl, especially now that it is a State Natural Area.

# AMENDING SECTION 2.13 OF THE ROCK COUNTY ORDINANCES-PUBLIC PEACE AND ORDER

#### Background

The Federal Office of Juvenile Justice & Delinquency Prevention documents intensive supervision programs as evidenced programs when managing high-risk offenders. The intensive supervision program in Rock County is both highly successful and a costeffective means of supervising the county's high-risk youth. In order for a juvenile to qualify for court ordered intensive supervision services in Rock County, he/she must meet three criteria: (1) the juvenile presents a risk to the community (2) the juvenile and his/her family have suitable living arrangements in the community (3) there are adequate support and services in the community. Most commonly, in Rock County, juveniles are placed on intensive supervision due to chronic violations of court ordered conditions or have committed a serious offense. As part of the intensive supervision program, youth are monitored daily by intensive case managers as well as Juvenile Diversion Services. These youth and their families receive intensive community-based services, which can include mental health treatment, day treatment, Aggression Replacement Training, AODA programming, etc. The goals of the program are to hold the youth accountable for his/her delinquent act(s), protect the community from further delinquent acts, and increase youth competency.

#### Proposal

This proposal is to request that the Rock County Board adopt, per 938.534(1)(b) of the Juvenile Justice Code, the use of short-term detention as a dispositional option for youth on intensive supervision. Under 938.534(1)(b) of the Juvenile Justice Code, if a juvenile violates a condition of his/her participation in an intensive supervision program the intensive supervision worker may, without a hearing, take the juvenile into custody and place the juvenile in a juvenile detention facility for up to 72 hours. Policy and Procedure for the implementation of the short-term detention would be regulated by the Human Services Department's Juvenile Justice & Prevention Services Division.

#### Justification

The cost-benefit of supervising these youth in the community is significant. The average daily cost of placing a juvenile at a state juvenile correctional institution is \$287 a day at an annual cost of \$104,755. The cost of supervising a youth on intensive supervision in Rock County is approximately \$26.00 per day with an annual cost of \$9,500. The use of short-term detention will allow intensive supervision workers the opportunity to immediately intervene in a high-risk offender's delinquent activity while ensuring community safety and planning for ways to redirect each youth to a crime free lifestyle while remaining in the community.
