Green Tips of the Week: Interest in gardening has surged as people realize the many benefits of homegrown produce. Not sure how to get started? 1) Plan Your Garden – Choose a location that gets at least 6-8 hours of sun, is protected from wind, and is away from trees. Vegetables need loamy, well-drained soil. Prepare the ground by clearing it of weeds and debris and turning it to a depth of 12-inches. A 10x16 foot plot can feed a family of 4 for the summer. If you don't have the space, use pots, hanging baskets/boxes, or rent a garden plot. 2) Tomatoes - Dig a hole the size of a basketball, add some compost and eggshells (for calcium), plant the seedling up to the 4<sup>th</sup> branch from the top. Give it lots of water at first to ease the shock of transplant. After that, 1-3 inches of water per week should suffice. Eventually, you will need to install support for the growing vines.
