V: Mutual Aid Frequency Coordinating Group

Sleeter stated he attended a second meeting of the Mutual Aid Frequency Coordinating Group and discussed the interference of the MARC channel. OJA offered to either pay for a PL tone on Illinois radios or pay for reprogramming them. Illinois has refused all offers. Sleeter stated that OJA has taken the position that the MARC channel is being used correctly by Wisconsin, and Illinois would need to take any further actions with the FCC.

## VI: Mobile/CAD Demo

Mosley stated there was a mobile/CAD software demo a few weeks ago. He has received two feedback responses. They are still in the fact-finding process at this point for replacing the existing mobile data/CAD software.

## VII: OJA

Sleeter stated that the OJA has made 3.2 million available for agencies willing to totally implement the WISCOM system within their city or county. Right now, they are looking for approximately eight concept agencies.
