WHEREAS, Potter Lawson Architects and Mead & Hunt engineering firm, who specializes in security systems, were hired to design and develop specifications for a 3-phase security upgrade at the Rock County Courthouse; 2 3 and.

WHEREAS, Phase 1 of the upgrade of the current, outdated security system at the Courthouse which consisted of camera system, card access, access controls as well as panic alarms is now complete; and, 6

WHEREAS, Phases 2 & 3 of the project will consist of remodeling the front lobby for screening all the public that enters; remodeling the east/rear stairwell to make it ADA accessible; maintenance repairs and upgrades 9 on both the front and rear parking structures and adding millwork to the high risk departments to create a 10 separation between customers and staff.

WHEREAS, modernizing Wisconsin's 911 system has been a priority for local governments, Public Safety Answering Points (PSAPs), law enforcement, and the telecommunications industry since the early 2000s; and,

WHEREAS, the 2017-19 state biennial budget provided funding for creation of a statewide emergency services IP network (ESInet), which is the first step in the transition to a digital Next Generation 911 (NG911) system; and,

WHEREAS, a NG911 system utilizes advancements in technology to improve communication with 911 operators and provides greater efficiency in assisting individuals in crisis; and,

WHEREAS, once the ESInet is operational, local 911 centers (PSAPs) will require NG911 capable equipment to connect to the digital system; and,

WHEREAS, currently very few PSAPs have the equipment necessary to utilize the ESInet and transition from analog to digital systems and while Rock County does have the necessary equipment as an early adopter, it is already due for replacement due to age; and,

WHEREAS, the average cost for the necessary equipment upgrades will exceed \$250,000 per county in addition to ongoing maintenance costs; and,

WHEREAS, while the state has provided grant funding for counties in the past to upgrade local PSAPs, state funding has not existed in over a decade; and,

WHEREAS, the state currently has a fund – the Police and Fire Protection Fee – whose original intent was to fund county PSAP upgrades; and,

WHEREAS, revenue from the Police and Fire Protection Fee is deposited in the state's general fund and has never been utilized for its intended purpose.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Communications Center has had Next Generation 911 capable equipment since 2013. However, due to the age of the equipment the Communications Center has submitted a CIP for 2019 and 2020 to replace 911 telephone equipment with an estimated cost of over \$225,000. This will replace the call handling computers, servers, and software. The software and servers for the Computer-Aided Dispatch (CAD) system were updated in 2018 at a cost of over \$260,000. The annual maintenance for both systems is over \$220,000. All of these costs are currently funded by sales tax proceeds or out of the operating budgets for the Communications Center and Information Technology.

Allocating the Police and Fire Protection Fee for county PSAP upgrades, as originally intended, would help pay for this critical equipment.

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) allows through administrative rule NR 210.06 that sewage treatment plants in Wisconsin do not have to disinfect sewage wastewater from October 1 through April 30th each year unless dates are modified by in an individual site Wastewater Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) permit; and

WHEREAS, sewage discharged without disinfection can have E. coli levels of around 10,000 colony forming units per 100 milliliters of water which poses a significantly greater public health risk than the maximum 126 units of E. Coli proposed in the NR 210 rule revisions during periods of required disinfection; and

WHEREAS, E. coli is a serious public health concern and efforts to minimize E. coli and other communicable diseases from surface waters used for recreational purposes is a significant step toward improving public health; and

WHEREAS, the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District discharges about 40 million gallons of effluent each day into the Badfish Creek which account for over 50% of the total flow in this water body and this discharge eventually ends up downstream in the Yahara River and the Rock River; and

WHEREAS, winter base flow water testing by the Rock County Public Health Department over several years has consistently indicated high levels of E. coli in the Badfish Creek and Yahara River during periods of non-disinfection of wastewater; and

WHEREAS, the Badfish Creek and Yahara River are popular recreational water bodies that receive significant recreational use that result in potential human exposure to impacted waters during the periods of non-disinfection of sewage wastewater; and

WHEREAS, the ultraviolet (UV) disinfection technology utilized by many wastewater treatment plants could be utilized for extended periods of time, or year-round, to significantly improve the water quality of the Badfish Creek and Yahara River and reduce potential adverse public health impacts; and

WHEREAS, the Rock County Public Health Department and Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District are cooperating to share data and are mutually interested in improving water quality discharged to Rock County.

- EXECUTIVE SUMMARY -

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (WDNR) Wastewater Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (WPDES) permits do not require that sewage wastewater be disinfected from the months of October through April each year. When recreational waters such as the Badfish Creek and Yahara River receive non-disinfected wastewater in large volumes compared to the normal stream flow, water quality impacts from E. coli bacteria and other communicable diseases are likely. The Badfish Creek receives over 40 million gallons of sewage wastewater each day which is more than the normal base-flow of that stream. The Rock County Public Health Department has confirmed through routine testing over several years that E. coli levels in the Badfish Creek and Yahara River are significantly elevated in these periods of non-disinfection of sewage, resulting in potential health impacts for recreational users of these waters.

The Badfish Creek and Yahara River have become increasingly popular for recreational activities such as canoeing, kayaking, fishing, and hunting. The level of these activities has grown annually and do occur throughout the year, not just in May through September.

The ultraviolet disinfection technology utilized by many wastewater treatment facilities could be utilized for longer periods of time, or even year-round, resulting in a significant reduction in potential exposure of recreational water users to communicable diseases, including E. coli.

The Rock County Public Health Department and Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District are cooperating to share data regarding this issue with mutual interests of improving water quality.

This resolution recommends that the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources take into consideration the adverse impacts that not disinfecting sewage discharge has on the water quality of the Badfish Creek and the Yahara River and that they take steps to reduce this impact to acceptable public health standards by extending the period in which sewage is required to be disinfected.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution authorizes the Land Conservation Department (LCD) to finalize acquisition of the Agricultural Conservation Easement under the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement program (PACE) for the O'Leary Family Trust Properties, which will be the third Easement acquired through the full donation component of the Program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

APPROVAL TO BEGIN ACQUISITION PROCESS FOR SELECTED 2018 PACE PROGRAM APPLICATIONS (FEDERALLY FUNDED)

This resolution authorizes the County to enter into an *Agricultural Conservation Easement Conveyance Agreement* (Agreement) with the landowners and Brabazon Title Company for one PACE application, for three parcels located in unincorporated Rock County. The Agreement identifies and outlines the agricultural conservation easement (Easement) acquisition process to be undertaken by the Rock County PACE Program. The first steps in the process include establishing an escrow account to be held by Brabazon Title Company, purchasing title insurance, submitting applications to the USDA-NRCS funding of a portion of the easement value and contracting for appraisals if approved for funding by the USDA-NRCS. Acquisition of the easements by Rock County is contingent upon funding from the USDA-NRCS and will be finalized only after future action by the County Board.
