Supervisors Bostwick and Arnold moved the approval of the minutes of February 26 and March 12, 2015 as presented. ADOPTED as presented by acclamation.

### 7. Citizen and Participation, Communications and Announcements

Ty Bollerud addressed the Board on the topic of Opiates, Opium and Heroin.

Jon Warner, Black River Falls, presented to the Board on behalf of Ho Chunk Nation. He introduced the members who were present. He explained that he has provided posters, drawings and details for Board members to view. He also had hoped to provide a PowerPoint that had many renderings and figures that he briefly shared. He shared the four branches of Ho Chunk Government and their function. Mr. Warner then began to address the proposed project in Beloit that is currently with the Federal Government Bureau of Indian Affairs for consideration. Once the Federal application is approved, the Governor must offer support. Once that happens, this project will get off the ground within 90 days. He explained that the Ho Chunk Nation has already established good business relationships with the Beloit Chamber of Commerce and Greater Beloit. They look forward to the jobs and industry they can bring to this area.

John Greendeer, Black River Falls, echoed what Jon Warner shared on behalf of the HoChunk Nation. Once the approvals are made, they are prepared to have a 600 person operation up and running within 90 days that includes gaming and food and beverage. Within the succeeding 90 days, the operation will expand to a 1200 person operation with more food and beverage and the addition of a hotel. They are hopeful to bring a conference center and amphitheater to the complex but that has other variables. Mr. Greendeer expressed pride in their care for their more than 7,700 Ho Chunk tribe members are cared for from k-12 to college to elders as well as the jobs they create on their land through tertiary services. He hoped the Board would consider a unanimous vote on tonight's resolution extending an intergovernmental agreement between them, the City of Beloit and Rock County.
