### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Awarding Contract for Gate Openers at Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport

The four electric gate openers budgeted for replacement on the Southern Wisconsin Regional Airport were installed in 2001. The openers are starting to fail. Replacement parts are becoming harder to find and more costly.

The Airport has several newer gates that were installed as part of the Airport perimeter road project completed in 2015 that are of a different style. These newer style gates are easier to work on and parts are less expensive. Having consistency with the gates will make keeping stock parts on hand easier as well.

These gates were originally budgeted for replacement in 2017 but the airport was not able to complete the bid process and gate replacement during that budget year. Funds from 2017 were carried over to 2018. During the 2018 bid process all bids came in at more than double the 2017 carried over amount. For 2019, the airport carried over the 2018 funds and budgeted for an additional amount to cover the increase in price.

## **Executive Summary**

Rock County created a new position of Master Electrician in the 2019 budget. We recently completed a recruitment for this position and was unsuccessful in finding a highly qualified, experienced candidate in our pay range. The applicant pool was small even though we advertised through the local International Brothers of Electrical Workers and our County website.

Human Resources conducted a salary analysis for local Master Electrician positions and found that Rock County maximum of \$69,968.88 was below average for wage and benefits in this area.

As a result of the salary comparison it is recommended to reallocate the position of Master Electrician from the current placement in range 21 to range 23. The new range for the position would be \$61,616.92 to \$74,875.68.

WHEREAS, many private property owners in Rock County feel that their private property rights,
 under current Wisconsin law, are not adequately protected from encroachment by outside entities, be

WHEREAS, a special legislative commission on the use of eminent domain shall be established to allow
 the public and local communities to voice their concerns over its use and for the State Legislature to
 explore revisions and amendments to the current eminent domain requirements in Chapter 32 Wisconsin
 Statutes.
