Employment Services Agreement

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into by and between the County of Rock (hereinafter referred to as "EMPLOYER") and Colin Byrnes (hereinafter, "EMPLOYEE"),

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS EMPLOYER whose address is c/o County Administrator, 51 South Main Street, Janesville, WI 53545, desires to obtain the services of Colin Byrnes to serve as Director of Planning and Development,

WHEREAS EMPLOYEE, whose current address is 434 N Oak Street, Oregon, Wisconsin 53575 is able and willing to serve as the Director of Planning and Development;

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants of the parties hereinafter set forth, the receipt and sufficiency of which is acknowledged by each party for itself, EMPLOYER and EMPLOYEE do agree as follows:

- 1. CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT; GENERAL PROVISIONS. Employment of EMPLOYEE is subject to the general supervision and shall be conducted pursuant to the orders, advice and direction of the County Administrator and be governed by the terms and conditions of Chapter 18 of the Rock County Ordinance, except as to the terms and conditions that are herein modified. Employment is further subject to EMPLOYEE's compliance with and implementation of policies established from time to time by EMPLOYER in the exercise of its lawful authority. EMPLOYEE shall perform such other duties as are customarily performed by one holding the same or similar positions in other governmental organizations or businesses which provide similar services. EMPLOYER reserves to the County Administrator the right to require EMPLOYEE to render such other and unrelated services and duties as may be assigned from time to time by the County Administrator.
- 2. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; GENERAL PROVISIONS. EMPLOYEE agrees to perform lawfully, faithfully, industriously, competently, dutifully and to the best of EMPLOYEE's ability, all of the duties that may be required of EMPLOYEE pursuant to the express or implied terms of this agreement, to the level of satisfaction that the County Administrator may reasonably require.
- 3. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; JOB DESCRIPTION. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in the job description for the position, as may be revised from time to time by EMPLOYER as circumstances change, and as set forth in applicable state statutes. This paragraph is further subject to the right of assignment reserved to the County Administrator, as set forth in paragraph 1 hereof.
- 4. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; OFFICIAL ACTS OF COUNTY BOARD. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall also include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in the ordinances, resolutions or motions of EMPLOYER's county board or any of its committees acting within the scope of their lawful authority.
- 5. DUTIES OF EMPLOYEE; DIRECTIVES OF COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR. The duties of EMPLOYEE shall also include but not be limited to those expressly stated or implied in orders, directives, or rules of the County Administrator.

- 6. TERM OF AGREEMENT. The term of this agreement shall be a period of 1 year, commencing at 8:00 a.m., Sunday, September 13, 2015, and expiring as of Midnight, September 12, 2016, unless earlier terminated under other provisions of this agreement or by operation of law.
- 7. NONRENEWAL OF AGREEMENT. At its expiration this agreement shall not be considered renewed unless extended in writing by mutual agreement of the parties. If it is the County Administrator's intention not to renew this agreement, the County Administrator will attempt to give EMPLOYEE three (3) months advance written notice of the intent not to renew this agreement, provided, however, that failure to give such notice shall create no obligation on EMPLOYER to continue EMPLOYEE's employment beyond the expiration date of this agreement. The County Administrator may extend EMPLOYEE's employment on a month-to-month basis for a period not to exceed 3 months, pending renewal of this agreement.
- 8. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; ETHICAL CONSIDERATIONS. EMPLOYEE shall at all times observe and comply with all ethical obligations imposed or required by constitution, statute, ordinance or other provision of law and shall at all times conduct EMPLOYEE's personal affairs in such a manner as to avoid a conflict of interest or appearance of conflict and in accordance with the duties and responsibilities of public officials. During normal work hours EMPLOYEE shall at all times devote all of EMPLOYEE's time, attention, knowledge and skills solely to the interests of the EMPLOYER, and EMPLOYEE shall never use EMPLOYEE's position or confidential information gained in such work position for EMPLOYEE's personal gain, either directly or indirectly.
- 9. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION. EMPLOYEE shall not at any time or in any manner, either during the term of this agreement or thereafter, either directly or indirectly divulge, disclose or communicate to any person any confidential information gained in the performance of EMPLOYEE's duties except as otherwise required or compelled by law.
- 10. EMPLOYEE'S RESPONSIBILITIES; EXCLUSIVE EMPLOYMENT. EMPLOYEE agrees to remain in the exclusive employ of EMPLOYER throughout the term of this agreement. The term "exclusive employ" shall not be construed to prohibit occasional teaching, writing or consulting which is performed on EMPLOYEE's time off and which does not affect EMPLOYEE's job performance, subject to prior approval of the County Administrator.
- 11. HOURS OF WORK. The usual and customary hours of business of EMPLOYER are from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, however, as a managerial employee, EMPLOYEE shall have as a condition of employment a job to perform and shall work such hours as are necessary to accomplish the tasks assigned to EMPLOYEE.
- 12. EVALUATION AND GOALS. At least annually, the County Administrator or his or her designed shall meet with EMPLOYEE to discuss job performance and to define goals and objectives for both EMPLOYEE and EMPLOYER.
- 13. EMPLOYEE'S DUTIES; LIMITED CONTRACTING AUTHORITY. EMPLOYEE shall not have the right to make contracts or commitments for or on behalf of EMPLOYER except as expressly authorized in advance by statute, ordinance, or express written consent of EMPLOYER.
- 14. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; BASE COMPENSATION. EMPLOYER shall pay EMPLOYEE, and EMPLOYEE shall accept from EMPLOYER in payment for EMPLOYEE's services, direct compensation at a rate provided for in the Unilateral Pay Plan for the position occupied by the EMPLOYEE.
- 15. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; COMPENSATION FOR EXPENSES. EMPLOYER shall reimburse EMPLOYEE for all necessary expenses incurred in the service of EMPLOYER, in accordance with Rock County ordinances and regulations on reimbursement of expenses, provided that EMPLOYEE complies with all applicable provisions of law and Rock County ordinances and procedures prior to incurring or claiming reimbursement for such expenses. It is expressly

understood that prior approval of the County Administrator is required for attendance at conferences held outside of Wisconsin and that attendance is further subject to the rules, regulations and ordinances applicable to managerial employees employed by the EMPLOYER.

- 16. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; FRINGE BENEFITS. Except as otherwise set forth in this agreement, and in addition to the monetary compensation set forth above EMPLOYEE shall receive fringe benefits as are enumerated from time to time in resolutions and general ordinances of EMPLOYER, on the same terms as these are made available to non-represented managerial and professional employees of EMPLOYER.
- 17. VACATION. EMPLOYEE shall receive twenty five (25) days of vacation commencing with County anniversary date, September 18. Carry-over of unused vacation shall be allowed under such conditions as are contained in the Rock County Personnel Policy.
- 18. COMPENSATION OF EMPLOYEE; TREATMENT OF DIRECT COMPENSATION FOR TAX PURPOSES. The direct financial compensation paid EMPLOYEE under this Agreement shall be treated as wages for federal and state tax purposes and for purposes of allowing EMPLOYEE to participate in the Wisconsin retirement system. EMPLOYEE recognizes that EMPLOYER will withhold taxes, Social Security and the like from direct compensation. EMPLOYEE shall be allowed to participate in EMPLOYER's deferred compensation program(s) and Section 125 Flexible Spending Account, at EMPLOYEE's option and to the extent permitted by law.
- 19. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYEE; NOTICE REQUIRED FOR RESIGNATION. This agreement may be terminated by EMPLOYEE on 30-days' written notice to the County Administrator. Any such notice, once accepted by the County Administrator, may not be withdrawn or rescinded. The fact that the County Administrator has asked EMPLOYEE for EMPLOYEE's resignation shall not invalidate any such resignation once tendered to, and accepted by, the County Administrator. Accrued but unused vacation and holiday time shall be paid out to EMPLOYEE upon resignation, provided sufficient notice as required above is received.
- 20. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYER; EMPLOYER'S RIGHT TO TERMINATE AT WILL. This agreement may be terminated, or any obligation of EMPLOYER under this agreement may be suspended, by the County Administrator at any time during its term, in the sole discretion of the County Administrator. EMPLOYEE shall be deemed to be an at-will employee of EMPLOYER who shall have no remedy or recourse in the event of disciplinary action, up to and including discharge.
- 21. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT BY EMPLOYER; DISCIPLINARY ACTION; PROCEDURE FOR DISCIPLINARY ACTION. All disciplinary action shall originate from the County Administrator and be accomplished by the County Administrator.
- 22. EMPLOYER TO INDEMNIFY AND DEFEND EMPLOYEE FOR OFFICIAL ACTS. EMPLOYER shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless EMPLOYEE, in accordance with the requirements of s. 895.46, Wis. Stats. EMPLOYER reserves the right to compromise or settle any such litigation in any fashion deemed advantageous to EMPLOYER, regardless of whether EMPLOYEE consents thereto.
- 23. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; NO ASSIGNMENT. EMPLOYEE shall not assign or transfer any interest or obligation in this Agreement, whether by assignment or novation. It is expressly understood EMPLOYER will not consent to any assignment of EMPLOYEE's duties and obligations.
- 24. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; SEVERABILITY. All parts of this agreement are severable from all other parts and invalidity of any part shall not operate to invalidate any other part.

- 25. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; WISCONSIN LAW CONTROLS. It is expressly understood and agreed that in the event of any dispute between the parties, arising under this agreement, Wisconsin law shall control to the extent that it is not superseded by any applicable federal law.
- 26. CONSTRUCTION OF AGREEMENT; ENTIRE AGREEMENT. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes any and all negotiations of the parties relating to the subject matter hereof. Any prior employment agreement between the parties, together with any extension or renewal of such agreement, is likewise terminated and superseded by this Agreement. All of EMPLOYEE's rights, of any nature whatsoever, arising from, by or under any prior employment agreement between the parties are hereby compromised in their entirety.

Accepting Arrowhead Library System's *Early Literacy Community Development* & Amending the 2015 Arrowhead Library System Budget

Library staff working with young children and families in the Arrowhead, Southwest Wisconsin, and South Central Library Systems seek new ways to address the lack of school readiness among children living in poverty. This project will focus on an asset-based approach to identifying resources and partnerships in all of our communities. A workshop, open to library directors and youth services staff, will educate participants in methods of Asset-Based Community Development to expand positive community/library relationships (date and location TBD). Mini-grant resources will be allocated for individual libraries to begin asset-based connections in their own communities as a means to building strong partnerships around early literacy development, so children in poverty are ready to learn when they enter kindergarten. Additionally, this grant will increase our libraries' capacity to foster early literacy community development by providing opportunities for cross-system collaboration.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The City of Janesville constructed a "shovel-ready" business park site at the southwest corner of State Highway 11 and County Road G. The City requested permission from the County to construct a new street, Innovation Drive, into the new park from County Road G. The City has agreed to pay the total cost of design and construction of this road in conjunction with the County's CTH G Reconstruction Project in the summer of 2015. Details of this project were approved by the County Board in a County/Municipal Agreement (CMA) on April 25, 2015.

Since approval of the initial CMA, the City has attracted a tenant to the park that has requested a direct access to CTH G in addition to Innovation Drive. This will be accomplished by a new Commercial Access onto CTH G approximately 1,000 feet south of Innovation Drive. For this access to be constructed, additional design engineering, real estate acquisition and road construction must be done. The City has agreed to pay the costs of these extra items.

This resolution authorizes a revision to the existing County-Municipal Agreement between Rock County and the City of Janesville for the design and construction of Innovation Drive and adds this new access. The City is the main beneficiary of the new access construction. WisDOT has also declined to fund any of the extra lane or related CTH G modifications required as a result of installation of this new Commercial Access.

The City is being asked to pay 100% of the additional design, real estate and construction costs on CTH G associated with accommodating construction of Innovation Drive and this new Commercial Access.

Retaining Engineering Firm for Design Services Relating to Phase 1 of the Courthouse Security Upgrade Project

The resolution before you retains the Engineering Firm, Mead and Hunt, to design and prepare the plans and specifications for the first Phase of security improvements at the Courthouse.

Phase 1 will include:

- -Duress Alarm System

Executive Summary

Retaining Firm to Prepare Plans and Specifications for Demolition of the Courthouse Tower

In 1994, the County Board endorsed the design for the 76,000 square foot Courthouse addition, including its colonnades, balconies, arched roof, two parking structures, and the tower. As an architectural feature, the tower was reminiscent of towers on two of Rock County's past Courthouses.

In 2011, the brick on the upper portion of the tower began to show signs of freeze thaw damage. Structural Research Inc. (SRI) was hired to assess the tower, and develop options for addressing the problem. Five options for restoration of the tower were presented, along with the demolition option. The General Services Committee sought public input on whether or not to keep the tower. The three opinions received from neighbors, favored tearing the tower down.

On September 9th, 2014, the General Services Committee voted 3-0 to remove, and not restore the tower. The low bid for the work was submitted by L & M Trucking of Wrightstown, WI. With an estimated start date of 9/20, the contractor listed a completion date of 11/1.

Since then the RRTI's focus has expanded into developing driving, biking, and hiking routes to promote recreational opportunities, ecotourism, and awareness along the Rock River corridor from its headwaters in Horicon, WI to its confluence with the Mississippi River in Rock Island, IL.

On July 5, 2013 Senate Bill 41 was enacted to create 84.10225 of WI statutes; relating to: designating and marking a specified highway route in the counties of Rock, Dane, Jefferson, Dodge and Fond du Lac as the Rock River Trail Scenic and Historic Route (SHR).

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) sets forth the terms and understanding between the County of Rock and the Rock River Trail Initiative to set the terms and conditions of the signing, installation, and maintenance of the Rock River Trail Scenic and Historic Route.

Executive Summary

Proposed Amendment to Section 4.401(5)(B) Part – 4 Floodplain Zoning Rock County Code of Ordinances

Amending the Rock County Floodplain Ordinance map reference, Section 4.401(5)(B) Part – 4 Floodplain Zoning, Rock County Code of Ordinances, will bring it into compliance with Title 44 of the Code of Federal Regulations Section 60.3 of the National Flood Insurance Program. Once adopted, the new Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) become the effective map for regulatory purposes and will be used for issuing permits, etc. For insurance purposes the new FIRMS will be in effect on September 16, 2015. After that date, the new Flood Insurance Rate Maps will be used in the National Flood Insurance Program. Federal officers or agencies will review the FIRMs in approving any form of loan, grant, guaranty, insurance, payment, rebate, subsidy, and disaster assistance loan or grant, for acquisition or construction purposes within floodplain areas. For example, this would allow the issuance of federally backed mortgage loans, the approval of most conventional mortgage loans, federally connected financing for acquisition, construction, repair, or rehabilitation of buildings, and the granting of federal disaster aid for flood-related disasters in the Special Flood Hazard Area.

Rock County received a Letter of Final Determination (LFD) from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) notifying the County that the revised Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) would be effective on September 16, 2015 and of the requirement that the local floodplain ordinance must be amended and the revised FIRMs adopted by that date. A Letter of Final Map Determination (LFD) from FEMA is notification that the physical map revision process is completed. A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE EXPANSION OF THE RIVERSIDE ENERGY CENTER

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Since the mid-1950's, Wisconsin Power and Light Company (WPL), a subsidiary of Alliant Energy Corporation, has been generating power from its Town of Beloit campus. The campus, which was originally fueled by coal, has since been 100% converted over to natural gas. Today, the Riverside Energy Center serves as one of WPL's natural gas generation portfolio anchors.

Due to increasing economic and environmental considerations, WPL must continually invest in energy-efficient, cost-effective and environmentally-friendly power generation sources. In response to these demands, WPL conducted a comprehensive analyses of its Wisconsin service territory options and concluded that expanding the Riverside Energy Center presented the optimal choice. In addition to leveraging its existing onsite assets, the Town of Beloit location affords WPL with a turnkey energy infrastructure. Plus, WPL already has a sizable land holding; thereby, reducing the need to acquire prime farmland. Lastly, this existing location has over 60 years of operational history with the adjacent property owners and the Town.

That is why this past spring, WPL filed its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity with the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin (PSC) to construct a 650 megawatt (+/-), combined-cycle natural gas power plant. With an estimated project investment of \$750 million dollars, this new plant - projected to be operational in 2019 - will supply the power needs of business and residential customers alike.

In addition to addressing WPL's power reliability, efficiency and environmental standards, this new power plan also provides a significant economic development boost. From an employment perspective, an average of 200-300 jobs will be directly supported by this project during its two-year plus construction period. A portion of the power plant's gross receipts tax payments, which are collected by the state and then redistributed through its shared revenue formula, will provide a significant financial lift to the local Town and Beloit and the County of Rock, respectively. When the Riverside Energy Center first began operating in 2004, the annual revenue stream to the Town was initially at \$375,000 and the County's share was double that amount.

Energy generation operates within a highly competitive and regulated environment, involving layers of state and federal requirements. As such, the approval processes for power plants and their related infrastructure support networks are extremely detailed and not without controversy. By approving this resolution, the County Board of Supervisors is leveraging, as well as capitalizing locally on, the economic development opportunities that come from these types of critical statewide infrastructure projects.
