WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety, makes Federal Highway Safety funds available to local law enforcement agencies for various traffic safety programs; and,

Executive Summary Authorizing Acceptance of 2014 Highway Safety Project Grants

In 2012, 52% of persons killed and 24% of persons sustaining incapacitating injuries in Wisconsin crashes were NOT wearing safety belts. Many of these people were ejected from their vehicle. Statewide safety belt use was 79.9% in 2012, however Wisconsin safety belt use still remains about six percentage points lower than the national average. It has been estimated that safety belt use by motor vehicle occupants in Wisconsin prevents more than 200 traffic related fatalities and more than 8,000 serious injuries annually. (Data is preliminary).


Click-it or Ticket (CIOT) Enforcement Grant recipients are targeted based upon seatbelt usage. The intention is to encourage extraordinary seat-belt enforcement in areas of the state with low seatbelt usage.

The 2014 Seatbelt grant is for \$5,000. Grant funds in the amount of \$5,000 will be used for wages and related benefits.

A local match of 25% (\$1,250) is required. The match may be an in-kind (soft) match or a hard match.

Executive Summary Amending the Sheriff's 2014 Budget to Use Equitably Shared Funds for Unmarked Vehicle

The Department of Justice Asset Forfeiture Program is a nationwide law enforcement initiative that removes the tools of crime from criminal organizations and deprives wrongdoers of the proceeds of their crimes. Federal law authorizes the Attorney General to share federally forfeited property with participating state and local law enforcement agencies.

Equitably shared funds are required to be used by law enforcement agencies for law enforcement purposes only. The intent of the transfer is to enhance law enforcement. It must increase, not supplant the recipient's appropriated operating budget.

For their participation in the program, the Sheriff's Office received funds in the amount of \$1,450. The Sheriff's Office plans to use the funds to acquire an unmarked vehicle.

In the fall of 2013, the Sheriff's Office filed a sharing request with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) seeking equitable distribution of seized property (vehicle). The sharing request was granted. The Sheriff's Office is required to pay 20% of vehicle's wholesale value at the time of the seizure, plus the United States Marshals Service (USMS) expenses related to the vehicle.

Accepting Arrowhead Library System's Digital Content Buying Pool Grant & Amending the 2014 Arrowhead Library System Budget

Summary of Grant: In May 2011 the Division for Libraries and Technology (DLT) sponsored a statewide E-book Summit. A major recommendation from the Summit was the need to establish a statewide digital content buying pool. In a follow-up action, a committee from the Summit and the Wisconsin Public Library Consortium (WPLC) set a target goal of allocating \$1 million for e-books and audio book purchases. That goal has since been met. Starting in 2012, DLT began committing grant funds for e-books to supplement funds committed by the state's 17 public library systems and their member libraries. For 2014, the public library systems have committed \$900,000 to the buying pool with DLT awarding \$100,000. Each library system amount is based on a formula of current OverDrive e-book use and system population. Persons with compatible electronic devices anywhere in the state can now access over 86,555 items from any of Wisconsin's 385 public libraries. This collection will grow considerably as new titles are added throughout the coming year.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Rock County Health Department applied for and was awarded a grant from the Wisconsin Division of Public Health, Bureau of Environmental & Occupational Health, in the amount of \$8,750 to develop and implement a Farm Safety Education Program.

Rock County is home to over 1,500 farms. Children who grow up on farms have an increased risk for accidents and injury from large machinery, animals, and heavy tools. In the United States, youth agricultural injuries cost an estimated \$1 billion per year, and youth agricultural deaths cost an estimated \$420 million per year.

Education and awareness can save lives and prevent accidents and injuries. The Farm Safety Grant will allow the Health Department to temporarily increase an existing 0.8 FTE Health Educator position to 1.0 FTE. The Health Educator will:

- Develop traveling displays to rotate throughout public facilities in the county
- Develop activity books for small children
- Provide information for school-aged children
- Write health columns for Rock County 4-H newsletters and Farm Bureau newsletters
- Develop PSAs for local radio stations
- Provide special safety presentations to coincide with National Ag Week (March 23) and Injury Prevention Month (April)

The grant period will conclude on June 30, 2014, at which time the Health Educator's position will revert back to 0.8 FTE.

RESOLUTION TO RECOGNIZE JOYCE HEREFORD

WHEREAS, Joyce Hereford has served the citizens of Rock County for over thirty-five (35) years as a dedicated and valued employee of Rock County; and

WHEREAS, Joyce Hereford began her career on September 18, 1978, as a social worker in the Child Protective Services Division. During her time there, she assisted in both the intake and assessment unit as well as the ongoing unit. Ms. Hereford supported families with the goal of uniting them back together as a family unit. Ms. Hereford had great success in this role as many of the families she worked with were able to reunite and function together after her work was concluded. On February 24, 1986 Ms. Hereford transferred to the Single Parent unit where her focus was with unwed mothers; teaching them good parenting skills and helping them find childcare while they tried to continue getting an education. In 1991, when the Single Parent unit closed, Ms. Hereford was transferred to the Child Protective Services Division where she case managed families and also assisted in child abuse and neglect investigations. While in that unit she maintained an ongoing caseload and again worked to help keep families intact. On April 6, 1992, Ms. Hereford began her career in Long Term Support. Ms. Hereford enjoyed helping frail elderly and physically disabled adults; improving the quality of their life by coordinating services that assisted to keep people out of nursing homes, and remain as independent as possible in their own homes or a community setting; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Hereford went into Social Work to *help* others. She advocated and worked on behalf of her clients; searching for services to meet their needs and providing quality case management. Ms. Hereford has demonstrated through her actions her belief in the "Golden Rule" by treating others the way in which she would like to be treated. Her compassion to help individuals with disabilities has benefited hundreds of people in the community. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

HIGHWAY JURISDICTIONAL TRANSFER AGREEMENT COUNTY TRUNK HIGHWAY M

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) has constructed a new segment of State Trunk Highway 59 (STH 59) south of the former STH 59 about one-half mile in the City and Town of Milton. It runs from STH 26 easterly about one mile and rejoins STH 59. This construction necessitated the relocation of CTH M. The State constructed the new County road as part of their project. The former CTH M was transferred to either the City or Town of Milton, or obliterated.

The purpose of this resolution is to authorize the acceptance from the State of a new CTH M between Milton-Harmony Townline Road and the new STH 59 east of the City of Milton. It also enables the County Board Chair to enter into Jurisdictional Transfer Agreements on behalf of the County to effect the change.

The road was in fact accepted informally previously, but this formal acceptance had not been completed, as required by law. The length of the new County roadway is almost the same as the former roadway. So there should be an undetectable change in costs to maintain the road in the long term. In the short term, the maintenance costs should be much lower, as the road is newly constructed. There is no effect on the County's General Transportation Aids in 2014 because of this acceptance at the end of 2013.

WHEREAS, a PACE application was submitted by Alan, Sherry, John and Christine Sweeney (Landowners) to the Land Conservation Department (LCD) in 2013 to donate a PACE easement on approximately sixty (60) acres of real property located in part of Sections 16&21, Township 4 North, Range 11 East, Porter Township, Rock County Tax Parcel Numbers 6-16-137 and 6-16-175.3; and,

WHEREAS, the application was recommended for approval by LCD and the PACE Council, approved by the LCC and County Board in accordance with the Rock County PACE Program Manual; and,

WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that an appraisal of the easement be completed by a qualified appraiser and meet the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) and other non-cash charitable donation requirements, the cost of which was approved by separate action to be paid by the County utilizing PACE Program funds; and,

WHEREAS, the PACE program policy and procedures require a signed Option to Purchase agreement between Rock County and the Landowners of the aforementioned properties identifying the purchase price of the Easement; and,

WHEREAS, while the acquisition of the Easement is considered a full donation by the Landowner, the transaction will officially be completed in consideration of the sum of one and 00/100 dollar (\$1.00) paid by the County to the Landowner; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this _____ day of _____, 2014, do by enactment of this Resolution authorizes an Option to Purchase agreement in the amount of one and 00/100 dollar (\$1.00), accepts the donation of the Agricultural Conservation Easement on the Sweeney Property and authorizes the LCD to undertake final necessary activities identified therein and obligate all necessary funds to complete said activities.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the County Board Chair and/or the County Clerk will act as the County's agent(s) for closing of said easements.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution authorizes the Land Conservation Department (LCD) to finalize acquisition of the Agricultural Conservation Easement under the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (PACE) for the Sweeney Property, which will be the first Easement acquired through the full donation component of the Program.

Acquisition of easements such as this is intended to protect and preserve productive agricultural lands in Rock County, encouraging and promoting the goals of a strong agricultural economy and community identity, intergovernmental cooperation, and a regional land use vision throughout the County.

For this aspect of the PACE Program, of the value of the Easement was determined by a qualified Real Estate Appraiser utilizing IRS approved standards and criteria. Conducting this appraisal process allows the landowner to deduct the value of the easement from their income taxes as a non-cash charitable donation.

If this resolution is approved, the LCD will complete the Easement acquisition process on the Sweeney Property.
