Youth in Government Update. Ms. Fredrich said she knows this could be a wonderful project and that one of the Milton 4-H groups just came back from DC. The long-term effect to these kids being in this program would be that they will let the schools know what is going on.

Chair Thomas suggested the Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts as another group of kids to contact.

Ms. Fredrich asked if it would be okay for her to contact the 4-H kids. The Committee agreed that she should do this.

Department Reports.

Council on Aging – Update on Legislative Issues That May Effect Seniors Ms. Lubben handed out a brief synopsis on the Proposed 2012 Budget and what it could mean and the Coalition of Wisconsin Aging Groups – Protecting SeniorCare. Ms. Lubben said a public hearing will be held on April 20th from 1-6 P.M. at Blackhawk Technical College. For most lower income people SeniorCare is better for them over Medicare Part D.

<u>Committee Requests and Motions.</u> Chair Thomas informed the Committee that Dean Pillard is retiring and that he would like to have a resolution honoring her on the next agenda.
