Supervisor Yoss moved the above Resolution for the Education, Veterans and Aging Services Committee, second by Supervisor Gustina. ADOPTED.

Consideration and Possible Action on Dining Center Closures – Joyce Lubben – Ms. Lubben said she is concerned about the Congregate Nutrition Dining Centers as she is pretty close to budget and has nothing to fall back on. Plus, she has a feeling funds will be cut for this program. Closing a site completely would be a savings of at least \$1,000 per month. The process would be to obtain written permission from GWAR, with approval from this Committee and the Advisory Committee, submitted 60 days prior to closing and notification out to the people 30 days prior to closing. The Committee looked at the various sites and discussed the number of meals served at each location, the average number of people at each location and the average donation at each location. The Committee also discussed the people who would be impacted from the closing of each site and what options would be available to this group of people.

Supervisor Yoss moved to close the Scoville Hall site, second by Supervisor Gustina. ADOPTED.

Department Reports.

<u>Council on Aging – Update Non-Emergency Medical Assistance Transportation</u>

<u>Brokerage – Joyce Lubben</u> Ms. Lubben said they saw a drop in ridership at first but the numbers are increasing as the people do not seem to be happy with the LogistiCare service.

<u>UW-Rock County – Landscaping – Interim Dean Kim Kostka</u> Dean Kostka said Oak Village has been out, the seed is coming up great and the watering is being done. The new shrubs will be put in once the design plan is done and the weather is better for planting, probably in August.

Dean Kostka said the new wall in the cultural center, which was separating, is under construction and is about a week ahead of schedule. The parking lot is being redone and the City of Janesville is putting a concrete pad in for the bus to pick up and drop off students.

Dean Kostka said registration is up about 3% over last year and UW-Rock County is now the third largest in the State for transfer campuses.

Dean Kostka informed the Committee the Board of Regents approved the UW-Rock County campus to offer a 4-year degree. They are hoping to be able to offer this starting in 2013. They will first need to be accredited.

<u>Semi-Annual Report of Training Costs Exceeding \$1,000 per Employee per Event.</u> The Committee accepted the report from the Veterans Services Office and asked to have it placed in the file.
