BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a project contingency in the amount of \$5,000.00 be established to cover change orders authorized by the General Services Committee.

# **Executive Summary**

# Cooling Tower Replacement at the Courthouse

The resolution before you contracts with General Heating of Madison, to replace one of the two cooling towers at the Courthouse. This cooling tower is older than the other, and has reached the end of its useful life. The Courthouse cooling towers are located in the concrete enclosure, between the two buildings, on the St. Lawrence Street side if the Courthouse.

What's a cooling tower?

The Courthouse is air-conditioned with a fluid refrigerated by a chiller. The chilled fluid is pumped through forced air devices and heat exchangers in the building. As the building cools, the circulating fluid warms and returns to the chiller to be cooled again. To help cool the warm fluid, a cooling tower is used. Water flows over a packing like fill material. A large fan blows over the fill material, evaporation takes place, and the cooler water is pumped to the chiller to help cool the air-conditioning fluid.

In short, a cooling tower is similar in purpose to a radiator.

Once the contract is awarded, six to eight weeks will pass before the chiller is delivered. Installation should be complete around May  $1^{st}$ . In addition to the contract amount of \$88,000.00, a \$5,000 contingency will be created to cover unanticipated change orders approved by the General Services Committee.
