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Executive Summary Recognizing National Family Caregivers Month, 2013

Many people don't think of themselves as caregivers. Across America, Wisconsin and Rock County, daughters and sons balance the work of caring for aging parents with the demands of their careers and raising their own children. Spouses and partners become caregivers to loved ones with issues of aging, disability or mental illness even as they navigate their own health challenges. Mothers and fathers resume care for children returning home as wounded warriors. Friends and relatives form networks to support loved ones with disabilities. All of them give selflessly to bring comfort and stability to those they love.

Many family caregivers go unnoticed and unrecognized for their work in caring for a loved one, whether it is a parent, spouse, child or neighbor. In Wisconsin, it is estimated there are 549,279 caregivers who give 588 million hours of service. In the market place, the value of these services provided for "free" is estimated to be \$5,836 million.

Nationally, more than 65 million people, 29% of the U.S. population, provide care for a chronically ill, disabled or aged family member or friend during any given year and spend an average of 20 hours per week providing care for their loved one.

The Rock County Council on Aging's National Family Caregiver Support Program and the Rock County Caregiver Alliance's mission is "Dedicated to providing awareness, education, support, advocacy and resources to facilitate community partnerships for caregivers."

The month of November 2013 has been designated as National Family Caregivers Month to honor the many individuals who give of themselves as caregivers.
