### Accepting Foodborne Illness Risk Grant Funds and Amending the 2019 Rock County Public Health Department Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

Foodborne illness is a common, costly—yet preventable—public health problem. CDC estimates that 1 in 6 Americans get sick from contaminated foods or beverages each year, and 3,000 die. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) estimates that foodborne illnesses cost more than \$15.6 billion each year. The Rock County Public Health Department (RCPHD) works with local, state, and federal partners to investigate outbreaks, and to implement systems to better detect, stop, and prevent them.

The Rock County Public Health Department has been awarded U.S. Food and Drug Administration funding to conduct a Foodborne Illness Risk Factor Study and establish intervention strategies based on the conclusions of the collected data.

As an agent of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) the RCPHD licenses and regulates over 800 public food facilities in Rock County, Wisconsin. Data from all facilities that fall within the four major industry segments (restaurants, healthcare, schools, and retail stores) will be included in the study. Routine inspection data will be compiled and analyzed to inform the creation of intervention strategies which will address the specific findings of the Risk Factor Study and become incorporated into the 2020 policies and procedures.
