### Accepting Public Health Crisis Response (opioid) Funds and Amending the 2019 Rock County Public Health Department Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

The United States is in the midst of an opioid overdose epidemic. The FY 2018 Consolidated Appropriations Act and Accompanying Report included an increase in funding appropriated to Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to "advance the understanding of the opioid overdose epidemic and scale up prevention activities across all 50 States and Washington, D.C." Funds were awarded to states affected by the opioid overdose epidemic via the Cooperative Agreement for Emergency Response: Public Health Crisis Response. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services is awarding a portion of these funds to eligible partners to support activities at the local and regional level.

Rock County has seen vast increases in hospitalization and death rates related to opioids over the past 10 years. The Rock County Public Health Department has been awarded funds to support the collaboration between local EMS providers and the Rock County Public Health Department (RCPHD) to develop a surveillance system using ODMAP and a public facing dashboard that would display opioid-related data for our partners and stakeholders. A centralized data system will better inform our partners and enable a collaborative response to the opioid epidemic.

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### Accepting Foodborne Illness Risk Grant Funds and Amending the 2019 Rock County Public Health Department Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

Foodborne illness is a common, costly—yet preventable—public health problem. CDC estimates that 1 in 6 Americans get sick from contaminated foods or beverages each year, and 3,000 die. The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) estimates that foodborne illnesses cost more than \$15.6 billion each year. The Rock County Public Health Department (RCPHD) works with local, state, and federal partners to investigate outbreaks, and to implement systems to better detect, stop, and prevent them.

The Rock County Public Health Department has been awarded U.S. Food and Drug Administration funding to conduct a Foodborne Illness Risk Factor Study and establish intervention strategies based on the conclusions of the collected data.

As an agent of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) the RCPHD licenses and regulates over 800 public food facilities in Rock County, Wisconsin. Data from all facilities that fall within the four major industry segments (restaurants, healthcare, schools, and retail stores) will be included in the study. Routine inspection data will be compiled and analyzed to inform the creation of intervention strategies which will address the specific findings of the Risk Factor Study and become incorporated into the 2020 policies and procedures.

#### **Executive Summary**

The Title V Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Services Block Grant creates Federal-State-Local partnerships to develop state and local systems to meet the critical challenges facing women, children and families. The Rock County Public Health Department utilizes these funds to support work related to breast feeding and safe sleep. Our objectives surrounding breastfeeding include supporting workplaces and childcare sites to become breastfeeding friendly along with supporting community groups to become breastfeeding friendly by promoting consistent messaging. Our objective surrounding safe sleep involves coordinating and/or providing trainings to implement safe sleep practices with childcare providers and community groups using common messaging. ### Accepting Nitrate Mapping Grant Funds and Amending the 2019 Rock County Public Health Department Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

Nitrates in Wisconsin groundwater is a significant environmental health concern. Current EPA estimates show that Wisconsin has the 5<sup>th</sup> highest percent of population whose groundwater is potentially contaminated by nitrate.

For the past several years, nitrates levels in Rock County's groundwater have become increasingly concerning. The Wisconsin Groundwater Coordinating Council has estimated that among Wisconsin counties, Rock County has one of the highest rates of private wells with high nitrate levels. Nitrate levels have been monitored by the county through voluntary testing program, and levels have steadily increased over the past 20 years. Approximately 30% of private wells in the county now test higher than the EPA's maximum contaminant level (10 ppm). The environmental conditions in Rock County are rife for nitrates leaching into the groundwater due to agricultural practices, septic systems, and the soil types in the county.

In response to the high number of private wells testing positive for nitrates, the Rock County Public Health Department (RCPHD) is creating a system for providing nitrate tracking data to our residents. A Tracking Mentoring Fellowship and award of \$2500 for Rock County Health Department was awarded by the National Environmental Health Association (NEHA).

These funds will allow us to gain skills in data analysis and communication as well as create engaging webpages within our website that will provide easy access to environmental tracking data to our stakeholders.

#### **Executive Summary**

The Preventive Health and Health Services (PHHS) Block Grant is a federal program which allocates funds to states to improve the health of the general population. One objective is to ensure a competent workforce through the assessment of staff competencies, the provision of individual training and professional development, along with the provision of a supportive work environment.

Through the 2017 Employee Engagement Survey, Rock County Public Health Department staff members identified "Professional Development" and "Career Advancement" as two key areas for improved engagement. The agency does not currently have a Workforce Development Plan, therefore the funding will be used to supplement efforts to improve workforce competencies and maintain a competent public health workforce through the preparation and implementation of a Workforce Development Plan. This will include identification of training opportunities around Healthy Wisconsin priorities for appropriate staff. This amendment reflects \$980 additional PHHS funding.

### Accepting Chronic Disease Prevention Grant Funds and Amending the 2019 Rock County Public Health Department Budget

#### **Executive Summary**

In 2017, Rock County's community health coalition, the Health Equity Alliance of Rock County, completed a community health assessment and community health improvement plan. The assessment and improvement plan identified obesity as a priority health challenge and as a contributor to chronic disease and other poor health outcomes in Rock County.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) was awarded a 4.75 year cooperative agreement from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). This grant supports state health department investments in implementing and evaluating evidence-based strategies to prevent and manage cardiovascular disease (CVD) and diabetes in high-burden populations/communities, contributing to improved health outcomes.

As part of this grant funding, the Rock County Public Health Department has been awarded \$30,000 to provide leadership for diabetes and heart disease prevention and management. Based on the Public Health 3.0 model, local health departments/coalitions can play a unique role as Chief Health Strategist. This role includes developing and/or strengthening strategic partnership, using a data to inform decisions and identify health disparities, engaging populations at greater risk of diabetes and heart disease, using a health in all policies approach, communication and awareness and evaluation.
