ROCK COUNTY HALL OF HONOR COMMITTEE Minutes – April 20, 2016

<u>Call to Order</u>. Chair Podzilni called the meeting of the Rock County Hall of Honor Committee to order at 4:00 P.M. in Conference Room N1 on the fifth floor of the Rock County Courthouse-East.

Committee Members Present: Supervisor J. Russell Podzilni, Chair, Rock County Board of Supervisors; Supervisor Henry Brill, Chair, General Services Committee; Tim Maahs, President, Rock County Historical Society; Richard Bostwick, President, Arrowhead Library System Board; Diane Shadel, UW-Rock County Foundation Board, and Charles Clark, Dean, UW-Rock County.

Committee Members Absent: Supervisor Rick Richard, Chair, Education, Veterans & Aging Services Committee; Teri Downing, President, Beloit Historical Society; Robert Hoerler, President, Luther Valley Historical Society, Inc.; Tom Sveum, President, Milton Historical Society; and Jennifer Eager Ehle, President, The Grove Society of Evansville.

Staff Members Present: Nick Osborne, Assistant to the County Administrator.

Others Present: Supervisor Sandra Kraft.

Approval of Agenda. Supervisor Bostwick moved approval of the agenda as presented, second by Dean Charles Clark. ADOPTED.

<u>Approval of Minutes – May 13, 2015</u>. Ms. Shadel moved approval of the minutes of May 13, 2015, second by Supervisor Brill. ADOPTED.

<u>Discussion of Procedure to be Used in Selection of 2016 Hall of Honor Inductee(s).</u> Mr. Osborne gave a brief history of the Rock County Hall of Honor and the criteria for selection set by the County Board is as follows:

"The Rock County Hall of Honor was established to recognize Rock County people, past and present, who have made significant contributions to the county and its people. The selection committee is seeking persons from all walks of life who have contributed their services and talents to the community. The selection committee is particularly looking for information on the broad contributions the candidate has made to the community, in addition to their employment contributions."

Mr. Osborne said the Committee can select up to three inductees to the 2016 Hall of Honor. Generally the process is to review and discuss qualifications and decide on the number of people you would like to recommend. A vote is taken by ballot and the Hall of Honor Committee's recommendation is forwarded by resolution to the Education,

Veterans and Aging Services Committee on May 17, 2016 and on to the County Board on May 26, 2016 for approval.

Review of Nominations. Chair Podzilni said, for clarification purposes, the Rock County Hall of Honor was established to recognize individuals and not groups or organizations.

Recommendation of Inductee(s) to the 2016 Hall of Honor. Chair Podzilni and the Committee discussed the nominee's contributions to the citizens of Rock County.

Dean Charles Clark said that what impressed him about Mr. Wartmann was the breadth of his contributions.

Ms. Shadel said that Mr. Erickson has had significant contributions to the Fourth Ward which go unnoticed by many.

Mr. Maahs said that Mr. Paynter has dedicated much of his time to the Ice Age Trail.

Supervisor Brill moved to recommend all three nominees for the Hall of Honor, second by Supervisor Bostwick. ADOPTED.

Supervisor Kraft said that she will deliver the recognition personally to Mr. Wartmann. She believes that Mr. Wartmann will be able to attend the Hall of Honor Ceremony.

The ceremony will be held at UW-Rock County and the date has not yet been set. Invitations will be mailed.

Adjournment. Mr. Maahs moved adjournment at 4:21 P.M., second by Ms. Shadel. ADOPTED.

VOLUNTEER: He serves on the Rock County Veteran's Service Commission since 2002. Chaired the American Legion's former Rock County Youth Government Day which, each year, had served approximately (100) high school juniors from Rock County area high schools. Serves as Chairman of the Nurses Training Scholarship Committee of La Societe des 40 et 8 since 1995 ... raising money, arranging awards funcheons and scholarship presentation of two (2) \$400,00 nursing scholarships for student nurses. He had been invited into the 40 et 8 in 1958. He held many offices including Chef de Gare (Commander) and a nine year run as Corresspondent (Secretary). He led the Locomotive crew at the same time and campaigned the #844 Loco in many area parades and visits to the Wisc. School for the Deaf and the Wisc. School for the Blind to delight the students with toys, games and train rides and entertainment by the 40 et 8 clown group. He was the 40 et 8 Grand Aumonier (Chaplain) for two years and brought the organization's 2004 MidWinter Conference to Janesville and had chaired a similiar event in 1970. For several years he teamed with the late Rev. Jim Hagerty, in providing Christmas cards. candy and our to aproximately (100) Veterans who were residents at Cedar Crest, Rock Haven, Caravilla and Mercy Manor. (The project ended when the resources dried up) Beginning in 2002 thru 2005 he worked with the Activity Director at Huntington Place. on planning and presentation of a Veteran's Day Program until she left the facility.

Became a Salvation Army Red Kettle Bell ringer in 1956 in 2018, marked his 63rd annual bell ringer ringer aig. And, for several years up thru 2016 he led the Post's S.A. Red Kettle at which time, he and (20) volunteers were the S.A.'s top money raisers with \$5.413.14.

In 1991 he established the Seeds of Hope fundraising project for The Janesville Council #108. United Commercial Travelers of America (UCT). He continues to lead the project which supports people with intellectual disabilities thru Special Olympics. To date the effort has raised \$16,500,00.

As a member of the Knights of Columbus, he volunteers to distribute TOOTSIE ROLLS each vear. This is a fund raiser for Special Olympics and other oranizations which serve people with intellectual disabilities. He previously headed K. of C. Council #10363's TOOTSIE ROLL project between 1990 thru 1995. He earned his Fourth Degree designation in 1986 and joined the 4th Degree Honor Guard as a participant in parades, funerals and civic events over the next 42 years, untill stepping down at his 82nd birthday.

LEADERSHIP: Since joining Janesville's American Legion Post #205 in 1954, he was elected to the to the office of Post Commander (5) times: 1958-59, 1965-66, 1993-94, 1988-89 and 1993-94. He served for many years as the Post's Legion Athletic Medal program Chairman and medal presenter. He served as Commander of the Legion's Rock County Council. He led the Wisconsin American Legion's 1st District as Commander for 1984-86 and served as a State Vice Commander for 1986-87 and State Chaplain, 1994-95. Other leadership positions have included: 5 years as Chairman of the P.R. Committee that ersee's operations of the Wisconsin Legion's Badger Legionnaire newspaper. Back in 1960-1963 he served as a member of the Legion's State Legislative Committee. He was President of The Wisc. American Legion Press Assoc. (WALPA) for several years President of the Wiconsin American Legion Past Commander's Club. Chairman of the State Legion's Religious Emphasis Committee for several years and as First District Chaptain for 15 years where he chaired Memorial and Religious Services. President of the Southern Wisconsin Assoc. of Life Underwiters for 1 year. Also, cochaired the SWALU Public Service Committee in 1977, earning The National Underwriter's prestigious Gold Dublin Award for Public Service which he received at the 1977 NALU Convention in Dallas, TX. For their project, The local Assoc. had chosen to equip a city ambulance with emergency resperatory equipment. President of the Janesville Patriotic Society in the 1990s and Chairman of the Society's Memorial Day Committee from 1967 thru 1976. Also led flag distributions on Vet's graves.

Funk joined the United Commercial Travelers in 1966 and served as the local President and other offices including Secv/treas since 1989. He served the Wisc. Region of UCT as President, and the other offices, includeing 6 years as Treasurer.

INTHEPENEHIAL: Between 1966 and 1995, Al and his wife Marge proudly owned and operated three rental properties, providing comfortable, market rate apartments for over for over (100) Janesville households. Furthermore, the Funk properties always "passed" the City of Janesville inspections.

From 1973 to mid 1995. All operated the Al Funk Agency and was licensed to underwrite Life

and Health Insurance plus Annuities.

For thirty years, 1970-2000, he had assisted his wife with her busy craft business where-in they participated in 500 Arts and Craft Fairs across Wisconsin, lowa and Northern Illinois. After retiring from the insurance business. Al devoted more time to to "crafting" including producing over 250 theme mailboxes.

OTHER CONTRIBUTIONS: While in the US Air Force (1950-54) he began donating blood. ultimately reaching the 5-Gallon Mark on 11-30-1994. He had to forgo further donations due to medical reasons.

Al joined St. Mary's Parish in 1954 and continues as a faithfull member to this day. Over the years he belonged to the St. Marys Holy Name Society, and served as President in 1967. During this time, the longtime Pastor, Msgr. E. J. Beck retired. Al led a committee that hosted Msgr. Beck's retirement celebration.

He served on the Parish Council and headed up the Parish Action Commission which conducted four (4) very sucessful combination pleasure/fund raisers: An Octoberfest. A Roaring Twenties Party. An Ice Cream Social and a New Tears Eve Party.

As a member of the former Beloit Catholic High Board, he co-chaired a venture to procure a 15-passenger school bus, to transport Janesville students to BCH.

As chair of the school's fund raising activities, he headed up a gala dinner party.

He spearheaded the purchase and installation of two (2) \$1,000.00 "Heritage Benches" at Janesville's remodeled Camden Play ground as projects for the Janesville UCT Council #108 and LaSociete des 40 et 8 Voiture #844.

At has enjoyed ownership of convertibles since the late '50's and has entered them in area parades as American Legion floats and as conveyances for Legion members, other

Veterans and dignitaries.

BRIEF STATEMENT: All established his love for volunteer work at an early age. While in grade he served on as a crossing guard on the shool safety patrol. Later on, for the "War Effort, All gathered milkweed pods from along brooks and ditches near his country home. The "Kapok" afforded buoyancy to life preservers for the military. He also served as an Altar Boy in his parish. While in High School, he vounteered in the school store and as a hall guide. Immediately after his graduation from Aguinas High School, at LaCrosse, Wi, he enlisted in the US Air Force for four years. He worked with "radar" and earned three stripes as an Airman 1st Class and the good conduct medal.

Al has a remarkable ability to share his time and talent with his family, his God, his community and his business associates. He has distinguished himself in all quarters. "Volunteering is a HEALTHY HABIT"!

Administrator, Craig Knutson and other Rock Co. leaders. She has been PROactive for the special courts and programs created to make our Rock Co. judicial system more equitable for ALL persons. It is important to note that the special courts have included: Drug, Veterans and OWI. Rock Co. has received state and national recognition for its leadership in providing for special treatment courts. Sandy has been a strong advocate for the treatment courts.

Sandy Kraft attended numerous Wisconsin Counties State Conference's and Conventions always seeking to gain additional education and knowledge of matters effecting Rock Counties best interest.

Serving along with Supervisor Kraft was indeed and honor and to this date I am proud to say she is a good friend and a willing helping hand where ever and whenever called apon.
