EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

APPROVING PLAT OF SURVEY TO TRANSFER EXISTING ROW ON CTH M

The Rock County Department of Public Works received a request from two adjacent property owners along the CTH M corridor to consider transferring excessive right-of-way to the adjacent property owners as provided in the attached plat of survey.

In 1969, plans were approved for the reconstruction of CTH M. The plans included a realignment of a curve, approximately 1,350 feet in length, located between approximately 2,800 and 4,150 feet east of USH 51.

With the realignment of the curve, the County purchased extra right-of-way on the north side of CTH M and maintained ownership and jurisdiction of the previous right-of-way resulting in right-of-way widths varying from 110 feet to approximately 210 feet. Typical highway rights-of-way are between 66 feet and 100 feet in width.

Highway right-of-way is a defined strip of land devoted primarily to transportation purposes, including pavement, shoulders, drainage systems and clear zones. Utilities will also utilize the right-of-way for housing their infrastructure with the approval of jurisdictional authority.


In reviewing this area, it was determined that maintaining the proposed right-of-way provided in the attached plat of survey would allow maintenance of the existing drainage system without regrading, blend well with existing right-of-way on either side of the curve, and allow for future expansion or widening if needed.

The excess right-of-way beyond the proposed right-of-way line, is not necessary for the safe operation and maintenance of this highway and is an added, unnecessary maintenance cost to the County.



Main Street, Janesville, Wisconsin 53545 (hereinafter "County") and the Town of Milton, a municipal corporation with its principal place of business at 23 1st St, Milton, WI 53563 (hereinafter "Town").

1. The following described property (hereinafter "Property"), is currently subject to foreclosure by the County for unpaid taxes, plus applicable interest and penalties: 11554 DONALD DR, Town of Milton, Wisconsin (Rock County Tax ID No. 026 066030). 2. The Town and the County are advised and do believe that the Property may be contaminated with hazardous substances, as defined in section 292.01(5), Wis. 3. The County has initiated action with regard to this property to obtain judgment vesting title to the property in the County, pursuant to sec. 75.521(8), Wis. Stats. to the property for the purpose of selling it to the Town which may then otherwise dispose of the property as it sees fit.

3. This Agreement constitutes the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the subject matter contained herein, and no Agreements or promises shall be recognized which are not embodied in this Agreement.




