EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Amending the 2019 Human Services Department Budget to Accept 10 Steps to Risk Reduction Training Funds

The Wisconsin Department of Justice awarded Rock, Jefferson and Walworth Counties \$14,000 for the purposes of youth justice system improvement, with Rock County being the identified lead in this partnership. Training will be coordinated for workers within the youth justice system to develop skills related to the use of evidence-based tools that can be integrated into case management strategies. The Carey Guides and Brief Intervention ToolS (BITS) focus on enhancing a worker's ability to understand the personal and environmental factors underlying a youth's delinquent behavior and provide workers with specific tools to teach youth skills for making positive decisions. Carey Guides are effective interventions for risk reduction and also serve to improve fairness and equity, address barriers to progress, and maximize strengths.

The DOJ grant covers the cost of the training and associated materials for up to 60 workers. During the first half of 2019, the collaborative leadership team will develop policies and procedures to support the implementation of the Carey Guides and BITS as well as coordinate the training. The 10 Steps to Risk Reduction training will be delivered in the fall of 2019 and then the collaborative leadership team will focus on quality assurance in use of the tools. The youth justice system improvement long term goals are to enhance public safety by reducing risk and increasing skills and protective capacities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Land Conservation Department wishes to update the current Clerk Typist III workstation to current standards. The system that is currently in place is comprised of a desk acquired over thirty years ago through the county surplus, a banquet style table for the computer station, and an old chair, also acquired through the county surplus. The present equipment has served the Land Conservation Department well, but it is time to update to current standards.

The Land Conservation will utilize the final fund balance account for the now defunct Gypsy Moth Program for said purchases. The current balance in said fund balance account is \$4,000.

The Gypsy Moth is an invasive species that defoliates large tracts of Oak Trees. After years of defoliation, old oaks will die. In 2002 the town of Beloit became quite concerned that the oak populations along Riverside Drive were losing their leaves. Private arborists confirmed the presence of the Gypsy Moth in the area and attributed the damage to them. After which the City of Beloit confirmed the presence of Gypsy Moth populations in the city's center and on east Milwaukee St. The state law at the time only allowed the County to manage the program. The county contracted with units of government and private landowners for abatement. As a result of this law, the LCD established the Gypsy Moth fund balance account to assist with the treatment of large population outbreaks. The Town of Beloit and the City of Beloit were the largest contributors to this account, since they were hit the hardest with extremely large populations of this Moth. This balance guaranteed treatment if federal dollars were not made available to the county through grants for said treatment in any given year. After the program was discontinued, the fund balance was prorated and returned to contributors. The remaining portion of the fund balance was for services rendered by the county for management of this program.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Communications Center's 9-1-1 telephone handling equipment (VIPER A9C) was installed in October of 2013 and is due for replacement per vendor recommendation. Typically the equipment lifespan is 5-7 years. We have had three positions fail over the past year, so it is important that we replace all positions so we do not risk having an equipment failure in the middle of an emergency call. AUTHORIZING APPLICATION WITH WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR SNOWMOBILE GRANT FUNDS

This resolution provides authorization to apply for funding for the 2019-2020 Rock County Snowmobile Trail Program.

The DNR Snowmobile Grant of \$64,440 would cover 214.8 miles of trail. The snowmobile trail project is 100% grant funded. Any field work (includes labor, materials, and machinery) by DPW Parks Division or Highway Division is 100% billed back to the grant. The area Snowmobile Alliance provides trail signage and grooming and is reimbursed for those services after the county costs are covered.

These funds are 100% provided by the payments snowmobilers have made through license and prorated fuel tax payments. Rock County receives a 50% advance payment check after the completed contract is signed, the balance due upon final close out of the grant.

SUPPORTING AFFORDABLE HIGHER EDUCATION AND LOWER STUDENT DEBT

WHEREAS, as student debt has continued to climb, it is clear there is an immediate need for action to ensure higher education remain an affordable option for students both during their college years and during their repayment period; and 3

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WHEREAS, according to the New York Federal Reserve, total student debt nationwide has 6 tripled in the past decade and now exceeds all credit card debt in the United States. Research done by One Wisconsin Institute shows that nearly thirty percent of households in the state are currently paying a student loan. Current policies prevent borrowers from being able to refinance to take advantage of low interest rates and make it nearly impossible to discharge student loans through bankruptcy; and

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WHEREAS, the growing student debt burden has direct impacts on our state and local economy. 12 Residents with student loan debt were more likely to forego the purchase of a new vehicle and more likely to rent rather than own a home. Funds tied to student loan payments are not available for discretionary spending at local businesses, stalling the engine of our local economy; and

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WHEREAS, in addition to borrowing, we recognize that need-based aid such as the Pell grant is essential to many students' ability to afford a college education. The federal government must find ways to strengthen and sustain this aid if education is to continue to be a path to greater equality in our community and an opportunity to ensure that every individual, regardless of socioeconomic status, has the opportunity to succeed; and

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WHEREAS, it is important for student borrows to have access to a variety of repayment options in order to best fit their needs and goals. Current repayment options also include a possibility of loan forgiveness after ten years of repayment during employment in public service or with a government employer. As a government employer, we must do our part to ensure employees are aware of this option and potential benefit of employment with Rock County.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors, on this , 2019, does hereby direct the Department of Human Resources to ensure each employee is notified annually that they may be eligible for public service loan forgiveness of federal direct loans repaid during their employment with Rock County and that the Department of Human Resources is further directed to, upon request for an employee, complete any necessary paperwork to provide proof of employment to those employees who are eligible.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges Congress to 36 adopt legislation which would allow borrowers to refinance existing student loan debt to address the growing student loan debt crisis.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges the State 40 Legislature to support the state Higher Ed, Lower Debt bill, which would allow borrowers to refinance loans and create a tax break for state residents actively paying back student loans.

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors urges state and 44 federal leaders to pursue additional solutions to the student debt burden, including policies that invest in the Pell grant program, reduce interest rates for future loans, and ensure tuition is affordable.
