1 2 3	The Board of Supervisors of the County of Rock, at its regular meeting this day of, 2019, does ordain as follows:
3 4 5	I. Section 2,204 of the Rock County Ordinances is created to read as follows:
6	2.204 Property Assessed Clean Energy Financing

The County finds that renovations or additions to premises located in the County made to improve energy efficiency, improve water efficiency, and/or use renewable resource applications, increase property values, stimulate local economic activity, provide local and global environmental benefits, and promote the general welfare of the County residents. The purpose of this Section is to facilitate loans arranged by property owners or lessees to make such improvements by treating loan principal and interest, fees, and other charges as special charges eligible for inclusion on the tax roll of these properties.
15 16 17 18 19 20	(2) Statutory Authority. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to Wis. Stats. § 66.0627, as amended, which authorizes a County to make a loan or enter into an agreement regarding loan repayments to a third party for owner-arranged or lessee-arranged financing, to an owner or lessee of a premises located in the County for making or installing an energy efficiency improvement, a water efficiency improvement or a renewable resource application to a premises.
21 22	(3) Definitions. In this section:
23 24 25	(A) Annual installment – means the portion of the PACE loan that is due and payable for a particular year under the supplemental agreement.
26 27 28	(B) Borrower - means the property owner or lessee of the subject property that borrows the proceeds of a PACE loan.
30 31	(C) Default loan balance – means the outstanding balance, whether or not due, of a PACE loan at the time that the County receives foreclosure proceeds.
32 33 34	(D) Foreclosure proceeds – means the proceeds received by the County from the disposition of a subject property through an <i>in rem</i> property tax foreclosure.
35 36 37	(E) Loan amount – means the principal, interest, administrative fees (including the Program Administrator's fees) and other loan charges to be paid by the borrower under the PACE loan.
38 39	(F) PACE – means the acronym for property assessed clean energy.
40 41 42	(G) PACE default provisions – means:
43 44 45	1. The delinquent annual installment(s) due when the County initiates the <i>in rem</i> property tax foreclosure on the subject property;

2. Any additional annual installment(s) that become due between the time that the County initiates in rem property tax foreclosure on the subject property and the date the 47 County receives the foreclosure proceeds; 48 49 3. While the American food supply is among the safest in the world, the Federal government estimates that there are about 48 million cases of foodborne illness annually—the equivalent of sickening 1 in 6 Americans each year. And each year these illnesses result in an estimated 128,000 hospitalizations and 3,000 deaths. The Rock County Health Department regulates and inspects approximately 850 food establishments annually in order to reduce the potential for food-borne illnesses in our community. Federal Voluntary Retail Food Program standards have been developed to ensure that facilities are properly inspected and inspections meet goals and objectives of the nine federal standards. Rock County will be utilizing this 'additional' FDA training grant to attend one of six national FDA training sessions before December 5, 2019. This training will allow our staff to assist in meeting the voluntary federal standards established by the FDA and to provide food establishment owners, operators, and workers with the latest information on food safety practices.

AUTHORIZING APPLICATION WITH WISCONSIN DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES FOR COUNTY CONSERVATION AIDS GRANT FUNDS

Each Wisconsin County is allocated a certain amount of money annually to fund small projects on a 50/50 match basis. Rock County may apply for a maximum of \$1,927 in 2019 for use from October 1, 2019 – June 30, 2021. Additional funds may be available after initial funds are distributed. Grant funds unclaimed by a county by the October 1st deadline will first be reallocated to other counties in the same DNR region that have requested additional project funds. Though this funding source requires a 50% match by the County, all time and materials supplied by the Parks and Highway Divisions, as well as other community resources may be used as in-kind match.

Rock County Parks plans to use this funding source to help pay for a (kayak/canoe) boat launch at Murwin Park. Kayaking has become a popular activity in Rock County. A boat launch at Murwin Park was recommended in the 2015-2020 Rock County, Wisconsin Parks, Outdoor Recreation and Open Space (POROS) Plan. Murwin Park is located approximately 11 miles northwest from the City of Janesville. This 40+ acre park encloses a substantial amount of shoreline of the Yahara River at the Village of Fulton. A boat launch would improve river access due to an increase in recreational activities. Murwin Park would provide an excellent place to launch to travel downstream to the confluence with the Rock River or a takeout point for people paddling the Yahara River.

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AMENDING SECTION 18.607 OF THE ROCK COUNTY PERSONNEL ORDINANCE

The County Board Supervisors of the County of Rock does ordain as follows:

1. Chapter 18, Section 6 of the Rock County Ordinances shall be amended to read as follows (new language underscored, deleted language struck through):

18.607 - Discipline/Investigations

8 The purpose of discipline is correcting job behavior and performance problems of employees. Employees 9 shall be informed of standards of conduct and performance. All staff must notify their immediate 10 supervisor within twenty-four (24) hours of all arrests and convictions for any ordinance (other than 11 minor traffic violations), misdemeanor or felony violations that may impact their ability to complete the 12 essential functions of their position.

14 No disciplinary action will be taken until a thorough investigation has been completed. Employees under investigation shall have the right to representation during the investigatory process. The employee will be allowed to have a representative of their choice who is not a supervisor or manager within Rock County. The representative will be limited to listening and advising the employee but will not be allowed to speak in place of the employee. Unilateral employees other than Department Heads shall be allowed to have a

19 representative of their choice who has equal or less authority than they do.

Employees may be placed on a Paid/Non Paid Administrative Leave during the investigation. Rules and standards shall be consistently applied. Penalties shall be uniform and shall match the infraction. Persons administering corrective discipline shall systematically document the case.

Records of written reprimands, suspensions, demotions and terminations shall be provided to Human Resources and kept in the employee's personnel file. Written reprimands will remain in effect for a period not to exceed one year, and at the end of such period shall be removed from the active Employee's personnel file. Records of suspension shall remain in the active Employee's personnel file for a period of two years and at the end of such period shall be removed from the Employee's personnel file. (This section does not necessarily apply if the employee is represented by an attorney.)

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Suspensions, demotions, and terminations shall be discussed with the Human Resources Director or the County Administrator before such actions are taken. In the event that the immediate dismissal action is required and the HR Director or the County Administrator cannot be reached, the employee shall be suspended with pay pending investigation.

An employee may only be suspended, demoted, or terminated for just cause. In determining whether just cause exists, the following standards must be applied to the extent applicable:

- (a) Whether the employee could reasonably be expected to have had knowledge of the likely consequences of the alleged conduct
- (b) Whether the rule or order that the employee allegedly violated is reasonable.
- (c) Whether the County made a reasonable effort to investigate and discover whether the employee did in fact violate a rule or order.
- (d) Whether the investigation was fair and objective.

REQUESTING THE WISCONSIN LEGISLATURE END THE USE OF PERSONAL CONVICTION WAIVERS FOR SCHOOL AND DAY CARE CENTER IMMUNIZATIONS

WHEREAS, there are multiple important and potentially dangerous communicable diseases that are preventable by vaccinations currently required by Wisconsin law for school and day care attendance; and,

WHEREAS, vaccine-preventable diseases can be very contagious, and can result in serious health complications, including pneumonia and encephalitis, and lead to death; and,

WHEREAS, the effectiveness and safety of vaccines have been well established; and,

WHEREAS, the Affordable Care Act has improved insurance coverage for vaccinations, which are readily available in medical offices and pharmacies, and public health departments continue to serve those eligible for the Vaccines for Children Program; and,

WHEREAS, all states require certain vaccines for school entry in order to

- a) assure that individual children do not contract disease in the social setting of school,
- b) protect other students from being at risk of disease and death from exposure to an individual student, and
- c) protect the broader community from these serious illnesses, including individuals who are immunocompromised and those who cannot receive vaccines for *bona fide* medical reasons; and,

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's immunization law Wis. Stat. § 252.04(3), Wis. Admin. Code § DHS 144.06, makes Wisconsin one of only 16 states that permits parents to opt out or waive some or all of the vaccinations required to attend school or group day care based on their personal beliefs; and,

WHEREAS, Wisconsin's percentage of students with religious and medical waivers have remained relatively constant over the past decade at less than 1%, but the percentage of students with a personal conviction waiver in Wisconsin increased from 1.2% during the 1997-98 school year to an alarming 4.6% during 2018-19; and,

WHEREAS, outbreaks of measles have impacted multiple states in 2019, and a number of other serious vaccine-preventable disease outbreaks have occurred in Wisconsin over the past 2 decades; and,

WHEREAS, several other states have recently removed personal belief exemptions from their legal codes, such that 34 states now prohibit the use of personal belief exemptions for school and daycare immunizations; and,

WHEREAS, the Wisconsin Public Health Association (WPHA) and the Wisconsin Association of Local Health Departments and Boards (WALHDAB) both support a change in school and day care center immunization law that eliminates personal conviction waivers for students in Wisconsin public and private schools and for children who attend group day cares.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this ______ day of ______, 2019 respectfully requests that the Wisconsin Legislature end the use of personal conviction waivers for school and day care center immunization requirements.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to the Governor of Wisconsin, Wisconsin state legislators, WPHA, WALHDAB, Wisconsin Counties Association, and other organizations as appropriate.

Executive Summary

Vaccines are one of the greatest public health achievements that have saved millions of lives by preventing the spread of infectious diseases. Unfortunately, over the past 20 years, Wisconsin's vaccine opt out rate has been increasing and is 5 times higher today than it was 20 years ago. The decreasing immunization rate among Wisconsin children is especially concerning to public health officials as more than 1,000 cases of measles have been confirmed in 2019 – the highest number on record in the U.S. since 1994 and since the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) declared measles to be eliminated in 2000 thanks to the MMR vaccine. The measles outbreak is a public health crisis and should be concerning to Wisconsin residents because measles outbreaks have been confirmed in neighboring states (Illinois, Michigan, and Iowa), and only four other states had higher rates of non-medical exemptions for the MMR vaccine last school year than Wisconsin. More than half of the states in the U.S. have had measles outbreaks this year.

Every state requires children to be up-to-date on the vaccines recommended by the CDC to enroll in school or childcare. Children who are allergic to a vaccine ingredient or who have damaged immune systems can get a medical exemption. Thanks to a principle called herd immunity, healthy people can make up for poor immune systems by creating a buffer of vaccinated people around them. Although specific goals vary by disease, the <u>World Health Organization</u> and others aim for 90 to 95 percent vaccine coverage to keep herd immunity strong. Many Wisconsin schools are trending toward, or have dropped below, 95 percent and even 90 percent coverage.

Data from the Wisconsin Department of Health Services shows a growing number of families are opting out of vaccinations required to attend school by using a "personal conviction" waiver. Wisconsin is one of only 16 states to allow personal conviction waivers. Vaccine waivers have become more frequent over the last two decades. Figures from the Wisconsin health department show that in the 1997-98 school year, 1.6 percent of students had an exemption to vaccination. That jumped to 4.8 percent in 2016-17.

FINALIZING THE O'LEARY FAMILY TRUST PROPERTY AGRICULTURAL CONSERVATION EASEMENT DONATION

WHEREAS, the Rock County Board of Supervisors officially approved the Rock County Purchase of
Agricultural Conservation Easements (PACE) Program and adopted the document entitled Rock County
PACE Program Manual, identifying and outlining all aspects of Program development and
implementation, on January 13, 2011; and,

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WHEREAS, the Rock County Board of Supervisors officially authorized staff to accept applications to the PACE Program for the donation of an Agricultural Conservation Easement and process applications according to the PACE program policies and procedures, on June 13, 2013; and,

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WHEREAS, a PACE application was submitted by O'Leary Family Trust to the Land Conservation Department (LCD) in 2018 to donate a PACE easement on approximately 109 acres of real property located in part of Section 18, Township 4 North, Range 11 East, Town of Rock, Parcel Numbers 6-17-166, 6-17-166.1 and 6-17-166.2; and,

WHEREAS, the application was recommended for approval by LCD and the PACE Council, approved by the Land Conservation Committee (LCC) and County Board in accordance with the Rock County PACE Program Manual; and,

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WHEREAS, the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that an appraisal of the easement be completed by a qualified appraiser and meet the Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) and other non-cash charitable donation requirements, the cost of which was approved by separate action to be paid by the County utilizing PACE Program funds; and,

WHEREAS, the PACE Program policy and procedures requires a signed option to purchase between Rock County and the Landowners of the aforementioned property identifying the purchase price of the Easement; and,

WHEREAS, while the acquisition of the Easement is considered a full donation by the Landowners, the transaction will be officially be completed in consideration of the sum of one and no/100 dollar (\$1.00) paid by the County to the Landowner.

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NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled this _______, 2019, do by enactment of this Resolution authorizes and accepts the donated Agricultural Conservation Easement on the O'Leary Family Trust properties and authorizes the LCD to undertake final necessary activities identified therein and obligate necessary funds to complete said activities.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This resolution authorizes the Land Conservation Department (LCD) to finalize acquisition of the Agricultural Conservation Easement under the Purchase of Agricultural Conservation Easement Program (PACE) for the O'Leary Family Trust Properties, which will be the third Easement acquired through the donation process by the Program.

Acquisition of easements such as this is intended to protect and preserve productive agricultural lands in Rock County, encouraging and promoting the goals of a strong agricultural economy and community identity, intergovernmental cooperation, and a regional land use vision throughout the County.

For this aspect of the PACE Program, the value of the Easement was determined by a qualified Real Estate Appraiser utilizing IRS approved standards and criteria. Conducting this appraisal process allows the landowner to deduct the value of the easement from their income taxes as a non-cash charitable donation.

If this resolution is approved, the LCD will complete the Easement acquisition process on the O'Leary Family Trust Properties.
