## RECONSTRUCTION OF ELM DRIVE BRIDGE OVER BRANCH TURTLE CREEK TOWN OF LA PRAIRIE

January 19, 2021 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The reconstruction of the Elm Drive Bridge over a branch of Turtle Creek will be discussed at a public involvement meeting scheduled by the Town of La Prairie and Rock County in Wisconsin.

The meeting will be held on Tuesday, January 19<sup>th</sup>, 2021 from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at the Rock County Public Works building located at 3715 N. Newville Road, Janesville, WI 53545. The meeting will also have a link available on the Rock County website (<a href="https://www.co.rock.wi.us/highway-projects">https://www.co.rock.wi.us/highway-projects</a>) to attend virtually. Residents are encouraged to attend via whichever format works best for them.

The Town will replace the existing bridge with a new single-span concrete flat slab bridge and reconstruct the roadway approaches on Elm Drive over a branch of Turtle Creek located in Section 25 in the Town of La Prairie, Rock County, Wisconsin. Work will consist of a temporary bypass, bridge removal, grading, concrete masonry, crushed aggregate base course, asphalt pavement, erosion control items, and landscaping items.

During construction, Elm Drive will remain open to traffic via a temporary bypass.

Work is scheduled to take place in the summer of 2022.

The purpose of the meeting is to present the preliminary plans of the work scheduled for the bridge construction project, discuss the proposed schedule, and gather public input. Any comments that may be of interest to the design team are welcome.

The meeting will be organized in an open-house format and interested persons are invited to attend at their convenience. There will be a presentation at the onset to provide an overview of the projects followed by questions. Representatives from the Town of La Prairie, Rock County, and Ayres will be available to discuss the design details, address comments, and answer questions. Displays showing the proposed project will be available for viewing.

Persons with a concern or knowledge about historic buildings and structures, public lands, and archaeological sites are encouraged to attend this meeting or provide comments to Rock County.
