Department Reports

Retired Senior Volunteer Program - Robert Harlow

<u>Program Update</u> Mr. Harlow said all the programs are running fine. The inhome volunteers distributed 2,050 items in 2009. They have two new programs: 1) Lunch and Learn at Beloit Memorial High School – teachers and counselors identify freshmen in need of help with homework assignments and this group of volunteers works with them. There are presently six volunteers. 2) Cell phone program – they collect used cell phones, send them in to be refurbished and when they come back they are used for domestic abuse and other 911 purposes.

Relocation Plans Mr. Harlow said they will be moving the office to a location on Riverside Drive, this will reduce their overhead nearly in half. They will be closing the office for the move on March 29^{th} and reopen at the new location on April 6^{th} . The Committee agreed May 18^{th} would be a good time to meet at the new location.

Veterans Services – John Solis

Wisconsin Veterans Home at Union Grove Rate Increases Mr. Solis said the issue of the rising rates has been brought up several times. The reason for the rates going up is because the facility had been receiving a supplement from the facility in King and, per state statutes, the facility has to be self-supporting. To avoid fines, the cost had to go up by approximately 65%. The nursing home portion is okay because they receive Medical Assistance.

<u>Wisconsin GI Bill Legislation Status</u> Mr. Solis said at a meeting with the schools the schools did not like some of the different legislative bills and a compromise is being worked on. He said, at this time, if you are eligible for federal benefits to use these first and the amount is based on years of service.

LZ Lambeau Ticket Sales Mr. Solis said the group heading up this welcome home Vietnam Veterans is offering discounts on the sale of tickets, 50% off for groups. He heard there is a motorcycle rally scheduled to leave from La Crosse to Green Bay on May 20th of approximately 150,000 motorcycles. He said this is a welcome home party for the Vietnam Veterans and no claims will be done, the only speaker will be the Governor, and the traveling wall will be there.

<u>Committee Requests and Motions.</u> Chair Wiedenfeld said the May 18th meeting will be held at the new RSVP center on Riverside Drive in Beloit.

<u>Adjournment.</u> Supervisor Thomas moved adjournment at 4:40 P.M., second by Supervisor Gustina. ADOPTED.
