FINANCE COMMITTEE November 4, 2010

<u>Call to Order</u>. Chair Mawhinney called the meeting of the Finance Committee to order at 7:30 A.M. on Thursday, November 4, 2010, in Conference Room N-1 on the fifth floor of the Rock County Courthouse-East.

<u>Approval of Agenda</u>. Mr. Smith requested item #9 be deleted. Supervisor Podzilni moved approval of the agenda with this deletion, second by Supervisor Diestler. ADOPTED as amended.

<u>Committee Review and Approval of Per Meeting Allowances.</u> Supervisor Podzilni moved approval of Per Meeting Allowances in the amount of \$14,283.89, second by Supervisor Diestler. ADOPTED.

<u>Approval of Minutes</u>. Chair Mawhinney said there was a correction on page 4 of the October 21st minutes; under Treasurer it should read "...fees <u>interest and penalties</u> on delinquent..." Supervisor Beaver moved approval of the minutes of October 21, 2010 with this correction and October 28, 2010 as presented, second by Supervisor Diestler. ADOPTED as amended.

<u>Citizen Participation, Communications, Announcements, Information.</u> Mr. Crittenden said Supervisor Kraft had asked at a previous meeting if it would be less expensive to purchase just Microsoft Word and Excel for some of the users instead of the Suite and the answer is that it would cost \$4 less to purchase Word and Excel by themselves. For the \$4 they felt it was worth the price to include PowerPoint and Access.

Supervisor Podzilni said he would like the Finance Committee to request Mr. Smith put the numbers together on the budget impact for the next few years on the proposed \$34 million Rock Haven building project for the November 18th meeting. The Committee agreed they would like this information.

Review of Resolutions

<u>Authorizing 2010-2012 Community Development Block Grant - Small Cities</u> Contract

"NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors on this _____ day of _____, 2010, hereby accepts the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program Contract for \$650,000 from the Wisconsin Department of Commerce – Bureau of Housing and authorizes the County Board Chair and County Clerk to sign the respective contract on behalf of the County of Rock; and,

Supervisor Kraft moved Finance Committee Endorsement of the above resolution, second by Supervisor Diestler. ADOPTED.

Review, Discussion and Recommended Revision to the 2011 Recommended Budget.

<u>Human Services</u> Mr. Smith explained this request in HSD – Crisis Intervention would create two .4 FTE positions and is offset by a reduction in Seasonal Wages. Supervisor Thomas said this would not require a change to the tax levy it is just a way of rearranging funds.

Discussed increases in various accounts due to State mandates, State budget cuts to the counties, and that counties are the State's agent to carry out these programs.

Supervisor Podzilni moved to approve this amendment to the 2011 Recommended Budget for the Finance Committee, second by Supervisor Kraft. ADOPTED.

Other Mr. Smith said the Interest on Bonds and Notes is due to the early redemption of final maturity of the 2002 Debt Issue.

Supervisor Kraft moved to approve this amendment to the 2011 Recommended Budget for the Finance Committee, second by Supervisor Diestler. ADOPTED.

Chair Mawhinney said we might need to look a little closer at some of the departments to see if we can lower the tax levy. Mr. Knutson said we can cut back, but we need to be careful to make sure it does not put the County at risk, especially in programs in Human Services and Developmental Disabilities. He added, as they look at the 2011 budget, to keep in mind for certain services if cut, costs will need to be paid for regardless if it comes from the tax levy or the General Fund. Supervisor Diestler asked if the tax levy would be cut from 3.67% to 2.99% what effect would it have on the taxpayer, with Mr. Smith replying it would be about \$4 on a \$100,000 home. Supervisor Diestler said he understands about the risk factor and added we need to keep in mind that we don't know where things will be in 2011 for the 2012 budget. Mr. Knutson added that we also will have a new Governor and we don't know the effect this will have on State Aid. We are working with unknowns and trying to keep the risk factors in mind.

Supervisor Kraft said, knowing how many people have lost jobs and all the foreclosures, she would like to see what would be effected if we went down to a 2.99% tax levy. Supervisor Kraft asked for potential changes to the Public Works budget to accomplish this. Mr. Knutson said they would provide this to Supervisor Kraft.

<u>Adjournment</u>. Supervisor Podzilni moved adjournment at 10:00 A.M., second by Supervisor Beaver. ADOPTED.
